Major Efforts On Behalf Of Haiti

Local efforts on behalf of the survivors of the January 12 earthquake in Haiti have been massive. As of our deadline this week, the local population had donated almost 130,000 euros and the Collectivity pledged another 200,000 euros in response to this generosity. These sums prove that we were all touched by the gravity of this major earthquake on our neighboring island. A large part of the funds were collected during the events held on the dock in Gustavia on Saturday, January 16, and coordinated by the Multi-Professional Economic Council, with monies going to support relief actions by the Lions Club, Rotary Club, and Croix Rouge. A total of 17,308,62 euros was raised via various sales in addition to donations given directly to the three service groups, each of which had its own stand on the dock.

Where does your money go?

The Lions Club Opts For Reconstruction

While they regularly send food and clothing to Haiti, this time the Lions Club opted for a different solution: "Until now, we preferred to send merchandise to Haiti. But in this time of emergency we felt it was better to collect money," explains Jean-Pierre Ballagny, president of the local service club, who announced that they raised \$44,000 on Saturday, January 16. On Monday, January 18, Regis Pain, president of the CEM, presented Jean-Pierre Ballagny, presdent of the local Lions Club, with a check for 5,584 euros donated during the fund-rasining events on January 16.



The CEM organized a Haitian relief day in which businesses, restaurants, and professionals raised more than 17,000 euros.

Lions Club decided on Friday what they would do with the money: "What I can tell you is that the funds will be

used in the reconstruction efforts, as it seems very difficult, if not impossible, to provide immediate aid."

In addition, the Lions Club purchased two 40' containers that should arrive in Saint Barth shortly. These will be sent to Haiti as soon as possible. In the meantime the club is continuing to collect donations c/o Lions Club, BP 186, 97098 Saint Barthélemy cedex, or deposits can be made in the dollar or euro "Haiti Disaster" accounts at the BNP.

Rotary Provides Shelter For 1000 people_

Without counting the first 20 that the Rotary financed last Wednesday, this service club succeeded in the purchase of 84 additional ShelterBoxes, these solid plastic cases that contain a tent for up to 10 people and survival gear. Nils Dufau, director of the Rotary's communication commission, told us that the first wave of 37 boxes, purchased on Thursday, January 14 via the Miami branch of the international ShelterBox association created in 2000 by a Rotarian, had arrived in Haiti. The rest of the boxes should be

here in the next few days.

Yann Perez, president of the Rotary Club, informed us that in spite of meeting their goals, in light of the enormous need in Haiti, the Rotary Club would "obviously" continue to collect funds to finance additional



One ShelterBox contains: A 10-person tent, blankets, water purification and cooking equipment, basic tools (saw, axe, shovel, rope), a stove, and other essential equipment such as mosquito nets, activity packs for kids, and a wind-up AM/FM radio.

ShelterBoxes. In fact, they continue to get calls from individuals and businesses that would like to finance additional boxes. To do so, you may deposit a check at the CEM or the BNP in Gustavia, made out to: Rotary Saint Barth (Action Haïti). A donation line has been established at 0590 87 05 01 (you can leave a message if no one is there to answer).

More Than 15,000 For The Red Cross In all, the territorial delegation of the Red Cross in Saint Barth collected 10,356 euros, in addition to the 5,784 euros they received from the CEM's actions on January 16. These funds will go toward emergency relief administered by the Red Cross in Haiti. "For us this seemed the best way to offer emergency aid to the victims," explains Henri Louis, president of the local delegation. The Red Cross has put an

emphasis on two efforts in Haiti: the establishment of medical centers and creation of potable water stations.



On Thursday, January 14 and Friday, January 15, the young members of the UMP political party held a food drive for victims of the earthquake in Haiti, collecting non-perishable items. By the end of the second day, they announced a total of 33 shopping carts of food and palettes with hundreds of canned items, dried foods, water, and milk. These items will be sent in the two containers that the Lions Club hopes to send to Haiti as soon as the situation allows.

Seeking Family And Friends

To offer as much assistance as possible, Alexandra Deffontis (on behalf of the Collectivity of Saint Barthélemy) has made a computer and staff person available to all Haitian nationals in Saint Barth. The goal is to use all possible avenues via the Internet to try and find missing family and friends who have not been in contact since the earthquake.

Almost a dozen people seeking up to 50 family members have taken advan-

tage of this service. For the moment, the search has not been fruitful. "We are continuing our research," says Deffontis, who in addition websites such as www.familylinks.icrc.org and www.koneksyon.com, has sent a list of the missing names to the Canadian radio station, Voix Tropical, broadcast in Haiti. Contact has also been established with the Haitian consulate in Guadeloupe in the hope of getting news.

HAITIAN PRIEST EUGÈNE KAZE AFFECTED BY THE DISASTER

Like all Haitians around the world, Father Eugène Kaze, the Catholic priest in Saint Barth, was personally affected by the earthquake that hit his native island. But for him, as for many Haitian expats, there were many hours of waiting and anguish before the first news arrived from his family. He finally got good news on January, 14 at 1:30am: "My 31-yearold brother, Pierre-Lucien, who works at the Ministry of the Interior and has been studying economics at the same time, called to tell me he had just been rescued uninjured from the debris at the university in Port-au-Prince, a 10-story building that collapsed like a puff pastry. He was trapped underneath for 48 hours! I didn't even know he had been at the university. In reality, I was worried about my sister who works at the Minustah (United Nations Stabilization Mission in Haiti), whose building was destroyed. I had spoken to her at noon when she was in her office and I imagined the worst. Fortunately she was outside of Port-au-Prince when the earthquake took place." Their parents live in the eastern end of the country and are also safe and sound.

The Montfortains religious community, to which Father Kaze belongs, was hit hard with the loss of 10 members when their building in Turgeau collapsed. The Inter-Institute for Religious Training (CIFOR) collapsed onto a minibus with seminar attendees at the exact moment they were leaving the building, causing 20



deaths. The cathedral and the majority of the churches in the Haitian capital sustained heavy damage, as did The Church of Saint Louis Roi de France, home of Montfortains.

Long-Term Aid

The Catholic community has not been excluded from the fund-raising efforts for Haiti that have taken place in Saint Barth since the earthquake. But the aid is for the longterm: "With the church council, we have opted to help with the reconstruction. Of a school, an infirmary, a hospital, that is yet to be decided," explained the priest, who can already envision "the day that light will once again shine in Haiti. For the time being, international emergency relief is taking time to reach the victims, but it is getting there. Now it is important to start to think about post-earthquake aid." With this goal in mind. Father Kaze told us that he plans to go to Haiti shortly and make an evaluation: "My objective is to come back with propositions for projects," concludes the priest, who found it hard to conceal his emotional pain a few days after the earthquake that caused 50,000 deaths according to the World Health Organization, or the 70,000 according to the Haitian government, or a possible toll of 200,000 according to the American Army.

An Ecumenical Service for Haïti

As local events and fundraising drives were underway to send much-needed aid to the survivors of the catastrophic earthquake in Haiti, the religious communities of Saint Barth joined together in prayer on Friday, January 16 for an ecumenical service at 6:00pm at the Catholic Church in Lorient. There were tears in many eves as Father Eugene Kaze, a native of Haiti, shared the pulpit with fellow Catholic priest, Robert Blanchard, Anglican vicar Charles Vere Nichol, and Evangelical pastor Iris Romney.

During the service, the island's spiritual leaders shared their thoughts and read various passages from the Bible: "Jesus invites us to be God's hands and work miracles for those who are suffering," said Vere Nichol, who read from Isiah, Chapter 43, in the words of the Lord: "When thou passest through the waters, I will be with thee; and through the rivers, they shall not overflow thee: when thou walkest through the fire, thou shalt not be burned; neither shall the flame kindle upon thee,". Father Blanchard noted that at his Sunday morning mass he thought of the Haitians who were unable to go to church themselves, as many churches have been destroyed: "We must have

faith and believe that this crushed people can rise thanks to the solidarity of all humanity, and become a people that can once again help itself." Two young Haitian women spoke, one in tears, the other praying to God to give force to all Haitian mothers to be able to get the food and water they need for their families. An email from Haitian filmmaker Arnold Antonin, who attended the St Barth Film Festival in April, described the conditions in Port au Prince as "apocalyptic," and that the images we see on the Internet and TV did not illustrate the reality of the situation but that moral support served as an enormous comfort to those who survived. Father Kaze, overcome by emotion, sang "Le deuil d'Haiti,*" which he described as a Haitian text set to music that the Haitians sing and play on the radio every time there is a catastrophe in their country. The words of this text seem particularly appropriate now, when Haiti is clearly bereaving. "This is the first time since the war of independence in Haiti that the rich and the poor are living in the same place: the streets," said Kaze. "The future depends on all of us. and I am certain that Haiti will be reborn from its cinders."

Didier Bensa New Head Of www.medici.tv

A classical music fan and director of the "Temps Musicaux" festival in Ramatuelle, France for the past 22 years, Didier Bensa (who also serves as president of the St Barth Restaurant Association) has become head of www.medici.tv, which recently became part of "Museec." Created in May 2008, and previously operated by the production house Idéale Audience, this web-based project is dedicated to classical music and offers concerts, operas, and ballets via live streaming or VOD (video on demand).

Hervé Boissière, who remains the general operations director, originally launched this initiative. Also a classical music fan, who listened to programs on France Musique, the 40-something Boissière has run various record labels, most notably Naïve (which produced singer Carla Bruni-Sarkozy), before founding www.medici.tv. By May 2009, just one year after its debut, the site had aired over three million live webcasts for more than 400,000 viewers in 198 countries.

The VOD catalog includes over 400 videos including concerts by some


of the top names in classical music today:

Claudio Abbado, Daniel Barenboim, Martha Argerich, Maurizio Pollini,

Nikolaï Lugansky, Anna Netrebko, Magdalena Kozena... There are also archive films by great artists from the past: Maria Callas, Herbert von Karajan, Leonard Bernstein, David Oistrakh, Mstislav Rostropovitch, Samson François, Dietrich Fischer-Dieskau... Plus interesting portraits of artists and composers (Glenn Gould, Sviatoslav Richter, Yehudi Menuhin, Philip Glass, Arvo Pärt, Karlheinz Stockhausen, Pierre Boulez...) by leading directors such as Bruno Monsaingeon or Frank Scheffer. And finally documentary films made by the best in the field such as Johan van der Keuken or Alexander Sokurov add to this virtual music hall available online 24/7, and which comprises the largest collection of classical musical videos.

In addition to the VOD offerings,

medici.tv's numerous live webcasts for music lovers have ranged from a concert by the Berliner Philarmoniker direct from Moscow, Mozart's opera Zaïde by Peter Sellars at the festival in Aix en Provence, 10 concerts from the Aspen Music Festival. Pierre Boulez at the Louvre, and The Chamber Orchestra of Europe to every concert from the 2008 and 2009 Verbier Festival programs, which attract an average of 800,000 connections each.

Goals In 2010: "To offer 60 new films for VOD each year," explain Didier Bensa and Hervé Boissière. "We also plan to develop the site internationally and add to the number of viewers worldwide by adding versions in Spanish and Chinese to the existing versions in English and French. In fact, China has over 20 million people who play musical instruments and represents the market with the most potential for development," concludes the new management team for medici.tv.

The Dengue Epidemic Continues:

VISITORS ON THE ISLAND MUST PROTECT THEMSELVES FROM GETTING BITTEN

Saint Barth has been experiencing a dengue epidemic for the past two months. Since the third week of November, over 340 people have had this virus, which is carried by the aedes-aegypti mosquito. In order to prevent dengue fever or to know what to do if you suspect you are sick, Dr Gilles Alayangues from the local hospital, Dr Deborah Brosnan, David Graham, and the St Barth International Property Owners Association have issued the following information:

Most dengue cases are benign, but complications can develop. Seek medical help if you develop dengue fever.

What is dengue fever and how is it transmitted?

Dengue fever is the most common mosquito-borne viral diseases in the world. Dengue fever is an illness caused by infection from a vrius transmitted by the Aedes mosquito. There are four types of the infectious dengue virus (serotypes 1 to 4). Types 1, 2 and possibly 4 have been identified on St barths. Infection with one strain will provide protection only against that particular strain. Future infection by other strains is possible. Dengue is trransmitted to humans by a bite from an Aedes mosquito that carries the dengue virus. You cannot catch dengue from someone. Aedes Aegypti, the dengue mosquito, can bite all day and takes only 1 days to complete its lifecycle.

How do I know if I have dengue?

Symptoms usually appear between 3-10 days of being bitten. Dengue fever is characterized by the sudden onset of high fever, which can last up to 7 days or more. It is often accompanied by one or more of the following symptoms: intense headache, back ache, body aches, joint pains, loss of appetite, nausea, vomiting and the development of skin rashes.

The most severe form is known as hemorragic fever (which includes a tendancy to bruise easily or other types of skin hemorrhages, bleeding nose or gums, and possibly internal bleeding). A blood test will often show low platelets. Patients with dengue fever often become dehydrated.

What should I do if I think I have dengue fever?

Contact the duty doctor in St barths on 0590 90 13 13. The emregency room at the hospital is fully prepared to deal with dengue. The doctors and medical staff on St Barts are experience in dealing with dengue and can provide excellent care and advice. If you have left the island, go to your doctor as soon as possible and tell them that you may have been exposed to dengue fever.

What is the treatment for dengue fever ?

There is no specific treatment for dengue or dengue hemorragic fever. Patients should rest, and drink plenty of fluids. Pain relievers with acetaminophen are helpful and patient should avoid those containing aspirin. Consult a doctor. Supportive care with intravenous fluids and frequent blood test monitoring can reduce

complications of the disease. In severe and hemorragic cases, bloods transfusions may be required. Hospitalisation is recommended for patients who have severe symptoms and for patients with signs (e.g, low platelet counts) that may lead to hemrrohage.

What precautions can I Take?

The best and only defence against dengue is not get bitten by an infected mosquito.

There is no vaccine or «cure». But you can take several steps to protect yourself. Applyling insect repellent is the way mots people protect themselves. But it is not the only way : wearing long-sleeved clothing, using mosquito nets while sleeping and staying in mosquito-free rooms are good measures to prevent mosquito bites. Individual measures for sick patients are very important to prevent contamination of healthy people. These measures are: insect repellent application on clothes and inside home protection with mosquito nets. Other measures include insecticide sprays and burning reppellent oils. You should decide for yourselves on one or a combination of these.






MOTHER TURTLE IN SAINT BARTH

There is a woman in St Barth who is attuned to the suffering of red-footed land turtles. Her name is France Arnaudo-nicknamed "mother turtle"-since for more than 10 years she has come to the rescue of these reptiles, giving them TLC when needed. Her home is a sanctuary for all injured turtles: those hurt in road accidents or by construction machinery, females having difficulty laying their eggs, or those suffering in captivity... no matter what their handicap, France is there to help them!

In five years, France has "repaired" 30 turtles whose shells were damaged, primarily in accidents along the road. The repairs consist of using resin on the shell or even fiberglass usually used for the hulls of boats. Plus all the nursing care France dispenses with the valuable



help of the island's veterinarians. Most of the turtles stay with France for a short period of time, just until they have returned to good health. Once they have healed, they are released on the high hillsides that remain a favorite habitat for these turtles. 


