

The “Capitaine Danet” Christened Under Pouring Rain

What better benediction than a benediction celebrated in the pouring rain? Sailors and brides to be take a rainy blessing to be a good sign. So in this sense it was perfect weather for the christening of the new SNSM (French National Society for Rescue At Sea) rescue boat, The Capitaine Danet, last Sunday morning: stormy skies threatening overhead with a downpour at exactly the right moment created good conditions for the future luck of the boat and its crew. To honor the solidarity of the sea, “a world without borders,” as noted the prefect in his speech, the rescue crews from the SNSM stations in Saint Martin and Sint Maarten came over with their respective boats. In keeping with tradition and the importance of the event, vice-admiral Henri Arigano, representing admiral Yves Lagane, president of the SNSM, and

admiral François Célérier, national representative of the overseas SNSM stations, both fly in from Paris for the occasion.

The ceremony began with a speech by Father Danet, the son of Théodore Danet, alias “Capitaine Danet,” a local pioneer of sailing ships who the rescue boat is named for. The priest, now

retired, is proud to see his father honored in this way, noting that through this tribute, all those who love the sea are also honored. With Father Numa, the local Catholic priest, Father Danet blessed the new boat, just as the rain poured down even harder. The civil christening—another tradition at sea—took place next with French sailor Philippe Poupon—the godfather of the Capitaine Danet—accompanied by Marie Jo (companion of the president of the collectivity of Saint Barth) who represented the official godmother, Laetitia Halliday, as they broke a bottle of champagne on the hull of the boat. The assembled group went aboard for a ceremonial tour of the harbor, to the sound of the foghorns of the sailboats and megayachts in the port. Following the official speeches, the traditional champagne toast closed the ceremonies.

Social Security Services Strengthened In Saint Barth

Plans are afoot to strengthen Social Security services in Saint Barth, as announced Monday by the management for Social Security in Guadeloupe, which is also responsible for Saint Barth. The idea is to now to have full-time coverage in Saint Barth, as spelled out in an agreement signed by Firmin Louis, president of the administrative council for Social Security in Guadeloupe and

ence increased from two days every two weeks in 2003 to 15 days per month as of April 2006, and will remain at the same level with the support of two agents hired by the COM: One is already employed by the COM, and the second position should be filled by the second semester of the year. The Saint Barth Social Security office will be located in premises provided by the COM, for the time being



The Social Security bureau for Guadeloupe/Saint Martin/Saint Barthélemy signed an agreement on Monday with the COM of Saint Barth for a new partnership that will lead to better social security services in Saint Barth.

There were 8450 residents in Saint Barth as of January 1, 2007, according to figures released by the INSEE (French Institute for Economic Statistics). This represents a 23.28% increase, or 1596 new residents, as compared to 1999, the date of the last census, at which time there was a total of 6854 inhabitants on the island. This marks an annual average of 2.7%, a higher average than in general in France where there was just a 0.6% increase in 2006, and where the other towns in Guadeloupe of less than 10,000 people, other than Goyave (+6% increase annually), did not increase by more than 1%. But this population increase in Saint Barth is lower than that from 1990-1999 during which time there was an annual increase of 3.48%. In comparison, in Saint Martin, during the same time period, the annual increase was no higher than 0.22%.

The figure of 8450 people is the first public estimate issued after the census taken last year in January and February, yet the official number will be finalized by the end of the year. 
Happy New Year Wishes From The Prefect

ST BARTH MUSIC FESTIVAL: From Puccini to Cole Porter

The final week of the St. Barth Music Festival featured a wide variety of music, from a chamber orchestra concert to opera, with an evening of popular songs at the Anglican Church. The opera, Puccini's *Fanciulla del West* (*Girl Of The Golden West*), was conducted by Steven Mercurio in his festival debut, with eleven singers imported for the occasion. Once again, there were less people than usual for the opera evening, perhaps due to the fact that "Fanciulla" is a lesser-known opera; or perhaps the festival needs to spice things up a bit (remember when they presented *Carmen* in the sports stadium in St. Jean—that was a night to remember...). But the singers were wonderful, and true opera fans certainly enjoyed the performance. Last Thursday,

one of the highpoints of the festival was oboist Alex Klein's performance in Mozart's *Oboe Concerto in C, K314*, which was part of the chamber orchestra evening that included Bach's *Brandenburg Concerto No. 1 in F Major* and Mozart's *Piano Concerto No. 13, K415*, with pianist John Novacek, who also performed Beethoven and Schumann as part of his

piano recital on Tuesday, January 22, the last classical concert before the festival turned to jazz with the John Ellis Quintet returning to Saint Barth for the closing event on Wednesday, January 23. Highlights along the way included an orchestral concert with the premiere of "First Wave," a short piece by Nicholas Audy-Rowland, a young composer who grew up in Saint

Barth. The evening of song on Monday, January 21, featured pianist John Novacek graciously playing accompaniment for soprano Jane Thorngren (a festival favorite) and baritone David Small; they were both delightful! The second half of the concert allowed the local choir, La Chorale de Bons Choers, to shine, under the musical direction of Charles Darden, with its popular gospel numbers on the program. In addition to the official festival events, those in the know went to an impromptu concert on the beach in Petite Cul de Sac with Hawaiian slack key guitarist Makana, who performed with the festival at Zion Garden last week. The St. Barth Music Festival will celebrate its 25th anniversary in January 2009, but could a fringe festival be in the offing....

Over 1000 Vignettes Sold In Just 15 Days

As of Thursday, January 17, a total of 1077 vignettes had been sold at the various points on the island where they have been available since the new tax on vehicles went into effect on January 1, 2008. This represents 10% of the 10,000 vehicles estimated to be on the island. "If you consider that this vignette must be purchased by March 31, the total is less than the logical aver-

age but is not shocking," notes Maxime Desouches, who feels confident that people will live up to their civic duty.

The vehicle vignettes are for sale in three places in Gustavia: the hotel de la collectivité (social services offices), the territorial treasury, or the territorial police station where a special agent has been hired especially for this operation.

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Catch Of The Day:

Fish Market Lunch At Le Toiny

It's no secret that Le Gaïac, the restaurant at Le Toiny hotel, is one of the best on the island, from its fabulous setting to its overall elegance, good service, and fine dining. Its long-standing Sunday brunch is extremely popular, and as of this year, the restaurant is offering a new midday treat, the Fish Market lunch, available every Wednesday. "It is really catching on," says maitre d'hôtel, Philippe Casadamont. "There aren't too many places that serve this much fresh fish, and it's very light and refreshing at lunch time." The three-course meal (45 euros per person) begins with a choice of appetizers:



carpaccio of yellow tail snapper with vanilla olive oil; tuna marinated with sesame and garlic served in thin layers with lightly cooked vegetables; chilled mahi-mahi and apple ceviche with red pepper flavoring. Warm rolls and but-

ter are served along with the appetizers. Once those have been selected, you are invited to take a large seashell from your table and choose your main course from a selection of whole fresh fish on ice in a boat in the center of the restaurant, or from a selection of fresh fish filets next to the cooking station. You place the shell on the fish you have selected. Chef Stephane Mazières, who comes from Toulouse, France, and is now in his second year at Le Gaïac, grills the fish to order in

when you go to make your choice) included red snapper, shark, grouper, tuna, bourse, wahoo, yellow tail and mahi-mahi, served with risotto topped with a tiny green salad. Desserts are also light and refreshing, with three to choose from: tiramisu served as a parfait with fresh passion fruit; West Indian coconut flan with zesty citrus sauce; or a sparkling bowl of fresh fruit salad with herbal tea infusion and sorbet.

In keeping with the fish market theme, the restaurant has been decorated in a nautical theme, with small lighthouses, little sea captains, tiny wooden boats, and seashells adorning the tables, and the staff wears yellow "slicker" aprons. There is even a fish net on the sofa in the entry area. The view at Le Gaïac is as fantastic as the food, looking out over coconut trees to the ocean, with surfers in the waves below. With a glass of chilled white wine



A Different Look at Primitive Art


The work of painter Jean-Charles Merle will be seen

Born in Sète (in the south of France), in 1942, Jean-Charles Merle studied modern architecture at the University of Nancy, where he became fascinated with the work of the painters of the fifties (from those of "La grande chaumière" to the Ranson Academy in Paris). He was greatly influenced by them until he found his own artistic expression.

A master of the "line" he nevertheless takes risks into dynamic interwoven designs. And from the gravity of the past, he progressively moves to a much freer gesture. From stylized forms, strictly enclosed at first, his graphical expression becomes more hierarchical in his search for spirituality.


