Tourism Lower In 2008, But Not Drastically

The figures for Gustav III airport and the Port of Gustavia for 2008 reveal a decrease, but not in a free fall, in the number of tourists recorded: -8.94% at the airport; and between -4.39% and -12.2% at the port compared to 2007, which had been a healthy year. From this point of view, nothing too dramatic, yet one must not minimize this decrease, which goes hand-in-hand with the 2% global decrease in tourism experienced in 2008, according to the World Tourism Organization (WTO) report made public on January 27, 2009. Analyze the details below.

At The Airport, A Lower Than Average Year

With 164,282 passengers (departures and arrivals), 2008 places near the bottom of the chart in terms of tourism since 1997— ninth position (out of 12 years), ahead of 2002 (162,683), 2004 (161,598) and 2005 (159,505)—with a net loss of 16,131 passengers compared to 2007.

The decline in commercial aviation (8.61%), also has hit non-commercial aviation in a big way, with a decrease of 32.35% in 2008, over the figures for 2007.

On paper, not all airlines experienced a loss. Air Antilles Express increased its market share by 64.4% percent over 2007. But this upswing is false: in reality it reflects a transfer of clients from Air Caraïbes. As a result, without this route, Air Caraïbes fell from second to third place for airlines that serve St Barth, behind first place Winair, with 57,852 passengers (a 6% decrease over 2007)

and Saint Barth Commuter, second with a total of 37,064 passengers. It is interesting to note that “Commuter,” the only Saint Barth-based airline experienced a decrease of only 0.2% in relation to 2007.

Of all the airlines that fly here, the only real winner is the private charter company, Trade Wind Aviation, which enjoyed an increase of a little more than 10%, with its total number of passengers climbing from 3,014 in 2007 to 3,324 in 2008.

Slowdown In The Second Part Of The Year

The statistics at the airport include more detailed facts and figures (such as where the passengers are coming from or going to...), yet there is more than just the numbers for 2008, a year where tourism did not follow any usual patterns.

The first three months saw a slight increase, a small percentage, but positive—between 0.35 and 2.95%—which gave way to April and a fall of over 21% compared to the same period in 2007. Since then, the level continued to fall to new “high lows,” all in the double digits as of September: -20.51% in September; -18.05% in October; -15.39% in November; and -11.10% in December. This trend reflects a decrease in tourism on a global scale as of the second half of 2008.

At The Port, Numbers Diminish

Throughout 2008, the numbers at the port were down, compared to 2007, a year that saw record highs. Yet the year

was not a total disaster. In the sector of pleasure boats (motor yachts and sailboats), even with a drop of 12.2% in the number of passengers from 2007, the year 2008 was better than average at the end of the day. With 34,564 passengers in this category, 2008 finished as the third best year since 1997. BUT, the first trimester of the new port season (from November 2008 through January 2009) saw a decrease of 19% in the number of passengers and 15% in terms of numbers of boats, indicating that the decrease is likely to continue over the next few months.

Ferry traffic also slowed down in 2008, yet the decrease was just -4.39% in the number of passengers compared to 2007. Like in the yachting sector, the first trimester of the current season (from November to the end of January) saw a larger decrease, closer to -22% in the number of passengers, which fell from 16,847 to 13,050.

As for cruise ships, 2008 was clearly the worst year since 1997, both in the number of ships calling in the port—147 compared to 188 in 2007—and the number of passengers—42,477 against 45,039 in 2007. Things look better for the months of November 2008-January 2009, with the number of cruise ships increasing by 4%, from 74 to 77, and the number of passengers up by 32%, jumping from 21,961 during the same period in 2007, to 27,752.

Global Tourism In Decline, But Not Everywhere

The WTO, which noted a slowdown in tourism during the second half of 2008, feels there will be a similar downturn in 2009. At worst, they predict a global decrease of 2% in numbers of tourists. At best, their prediction is for the status quo. In their scenario, Europe and the Americas (including the Caribbean) should be the regions the most affected by this downtown, with the numbers exceeding the average for certain destinations, due to the economic crisis which has caused a recession in certain zones. In Asia, the Pacific, Africa, and the Middle East, according to the WTO, the trend will be a growth in tourism, even if it is less than was experienced in recent years.

Contrasting Situation In The Caribbean

On January 29, the CTO or Caribbean Tourism Organization, released its statistics concerning tourism in 2008 for its members. These statistics vary, according to the destinations. The report reveals that Anguilla had 10% fewer visitors from January through August, but that Saint Martin (not counting cruise ships) saw a 3.9% increase for the months of January through October 2008. The largest gain in 2008 was that of Curaçao, with an increase of 30.9% (266,164 visitors) between January and September, followed by Aruba (+15.9% from January to April with 295,841 visitors), and Cuba, +10.9% (1.9 million visitors) from January to October. The largest drop was in Guyana, with a decrease of 25.8% (38,590 visitors) between January and May, after Anguilla, (53,077 visitors, -10.8% between January and August), and Saint Vincent and the Grenadines (52,899 visitors, -10.4%). The only member from the French West Indies is Martinique, which reported a decrease of 4.4% from January to August.

Out of 27 destinations, 13 reported a decrease in tourism during 2008.

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Rumors Of A Fuel Shortage



Last Tuesday, worried drivers waited in long lines at both of the island's gas stations, creating major traffic jams in Lorient and Saint Jean!

This flocking to the pumps came on the heels of a report that general strikes were strengthening in Guadeloupe and Martinique, where the reserves are kept for the Antilles fuel company, SARA, which provides fuel to Saint Barth. Many people feared that the reserves and the ports would be blocked, and if so, delivery of fuel would be impossible.

The situation accelerated to the point where the Collectivity had to release a statement denying a fuel shortage, or even the risk of one. Signed by first vice-presi-

dent Yves Gréaux, the statement noted that, "the rumors of a fuel shortage are totally false. The current reserves are at their normal level, and with the normal use by customers would easily last until the next fuel delivery, which is scheduled for the end of February." In addition, "Contacts has already been made to ensure delivery from another source, if necessary."

ONE LITER OF GAS AT 1 EURO!
Due to the decrease of fuel prices in Guadeloupe last Monday, one liter of lead-free gas in Saint Barth fell to 1.06 euro on Monday morning, a price lower than that of August 2005. Diesel fuel was priced at 1.02 euro per liter.

Douchy, The Oldest Person In France, Turns 113 On Monday!

Eugénie Blanchard, known as "Douchy," lives at the Hospital de Bruyn in Gustavia, and became the oldest person in France on May 25, 2008 according to the INSERM, (French National Institute For Health and Medical Research), which has studied the aging of the population since 2003. On Monday, February 16, Douchy will celebrate her

113th birthday, and the staff of the hospital has prepared a ceremony in her honor, and all those who wish to join them are invited to stop by. The day will begin with a mass at 8:30am, and school children are invited to stop by all day. Music and singing will be provided by The Romantics and La Chorale des Bons Choeurs.


FEBRUARY JUNIOR CHESS TOURNAMENT

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

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People Watch

ROSS COPPELMAN

Coppelman put aside preconceived notions of what he “should” do in life, to do what he really loves doing instead. His work is currently on display at Les Artisans in Gustavia.

“I didn’t want to go to grad school,” says Coppelman. He felt he wanted to do something with his hands, and in 1970 set off for nearby Cape Cod. “There were a lot of artists living there then,” he recalls. “I got a job in a small handmade silver business at \$1.50 an hour. Three months later I was laid off and started doing my own work.” As a way to release his creative

energy, Coppelman became a self-taught jeweler: “This has advantages and disadvantages,” he says. “One of the advantages is that you don’t know what you’re not supposed to do.”

One of the things he did, but would have been told shouldn’t be done, was work with 22K gold, as it is considered too soft. He was working with platinum on 22K gold but found the combination too expensive, and has shifted to sprinkling gold dust on sterling silver, “like sand,” he says. “I like the randomness of it. You never know exactly what will happen. That’s what makes it interesting.”

Coppelman also works with various stones, such as pearls and turquoise he has been cutting himself and studding with diamonds. “I used to do everything with stones, but now work more in silver and gold,” he admits. Yet his collection

A new line of silver and gold pieces is based on Coppelman’s environment in Cape Cod: “I was watching the sunset and the water, and started doing pieces with curves as waves,” he explains. There are bracelets with waves and the sun, as well as pieces with diamonds accenting the precious metals. “If something hits me emotionally, it shows up in my work eventually.”

After visiting Saint Barth several times with Susan, his wife of almost 40 years (they were high school sweethearts), Ross met JoAnne Quetel and Albert Yaphet from Les Artisans and they added a few of his pieces to their collection. This year marks his first full show at the boutique/gallery. “My work is more accessible than in the past,” he says. “It has a wider appeal for people who might not like art jewelry.”



has a colorful necklace of red sponge coral and black lava rock with a gold and diamond pendant, a necklace of white Chinese fresh water pearls (called petal pearls as they look like corn flakes, he notes) with a 22K gold, platinum, and diamond closure, and an elegant aquamarine pendant.

With his own shop in Cape Cod the busiest during the summer months, Coppelman enjoys his annual visit to the island: “The only time I get to go to the beach is in Saint Barth,” he says, happy to be able to combine business with pleasure!
