

# Air Show To Celebrate 25th Anniversary Of The Bucket

The spectacle of the 2011 St Barth Bucket will not only be at sea, but also in the air, as the Bucket Regattas, the first of which took place in August 1986 in Nantucket, Massachusetts, celebrate their 25th anniversary. As part of this fabulous nautical event, which features a fleet of 40 magnificent sailboats, a spectacular Air Show is also on the roster of events.

The idea for this unique air show—and the first time such an event will take place in Saint Barth—was put forth by the owner of the 55' Ketch Marie, built at Vitters Shipyard and launched last summer. As the owner also owns the Texas Flying Legends Museum, whose goal is to collect Second World War American fighter planes still in flying condition. He wanted to celebrate the 25 years of the Bucket in the air, and proposed the idea to Bruno Magras, president of the Collectivity, also an aviation enthusiast, to bring these vintage planes to the skies of Saint Barth. All they needed was to find an organizer for such an event, which in light of aviation regulations, must be French. As a result, the new non-profit association, The Saint Barth Aero-

nautic Club (CASB), whose president is Jean Belotti, stepped up to the plate to undertake the job of organizing this event and getting administrative authorization as required.

## HIGH FLYING AEROBATICS

Four planes from the Texas Flying Legends Museum are set to participate in the air show that will take place over the three days of the Saint Barth Bucket: a P-51 D Mustang, a B-25 J Mitchell, a Goodyear FG1D Corsair, and a Curtiss P-40K. In addition to fly-bys, these WWII fighter planes will also perform a 40-minute show of aerial acrobatics in an airspace reserved especially for them—two nautical miles by one mile wide, and up to an altitude of 1500 meters (5000 feet) in an area south of Saint Barth.

The program for the air show was coordinated in conjunction with the CASB and its flight director, François Macé, a former pilot and aerial acrobatics instructor. The pilots are from the Texas Flying Legends Museum, on a break from their usual duties. The four legendary planes will only be visible in the air: due to the small size of the runway at Saint Barth's Gustav III airport, they will take off and land from the tarmac at Juliana in Sint Maarten.

## AIRPORT UP BY 10.7%


A strong start for 2011 at the airport in St Jean: 16,473 passengers (arrivals and departures) were recorded during the month of January. This represents an increase of 10.7% over the same month in 2010, which saw just 14,921 passengers. This increase is not yet at the level before the global financial crisis, as January 2008 marked a peak of 19,100 passengers. Within this steady increase since November 2010, the largest spike is from international traffic, which has shown a rise of 14.7%. National traffic remained fairly steady with a slight increase of 1%. The high-point of the season was January 2, 2011, with a total of 915 passengers coming or going, and 225 various flights taking off or landing.

# Overseas French Painters In Honor Of Georges Rohner

As part of the French celebration of the “Year Of Overseas Territories” in 2011, the Collectivity of St Barthélemy is presenting a traveling exhibit comprising the work of five contemporary painters from the French West Indies and French Guyana— Michelle

exhibition, for St Martin. The exhibit runs through March 14 at the Hotel de la Collectivité in Gustavia.

What is the connection to Georges Rohner (1913-2000), a French figurative painter? In fact, Rohner did his French military service in Guadeloupe, and in 1936 completed paintings for the prefecture in Basse Terre and the headquarters for the Banque de la Guadeloupe in Pointe-A-Pitre.

Today, this important artwork is considered part of the national historic register. The bank, now La Banque des Antilles Française (BDAF), recently restored one of Rohner’s paintings with the financial help of the regional office of the French Ministry of Culture (DRAC-Guadeloupe). A large reproduction of this painting forms the centerpiece of the traveling

exhibit, which will tour the French Caribbean islands and Guyana, as well as Paris.

The five contemporary painters who are part of the exhibit were selected for their neo-figurative work that reflects Rohner’s style. “We all work in a contemporary figurative manner in spite of the current trend toward abstract or conceptual art,” says Heckley, “He notes that there will be a total of 50 or so paintings on display, all of which are for sale. “If a painting is sold, it can be loaned for the duration of the tour, or replaced by another work by the artist,” Heckley adds.

The exhibit is sponsored by the BDAF and the DRAC, with participation by the Collectivity of St Barthélemy for the local leg.

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
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


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# Yann Arthus-Bertrand, Guest Of Honor At 2011 Literary Festival

A renowned photographer and activist, known for his animal studies as well as his images of "The Earth From Above," which provide a unique vision of our planet, Yann Arthus-Bertrand has become one of the global leaders of the environmental movement, and since 2009, has served as the United Nations Environment Program Goodwill Ambassador. Arthus-Bertrand will be the guest of honor at the Saint Barth literary festival that takes place from March 28-April 3, 2011, as organized by the non-profit association, Saint B' Art.



"Yann Arthus-Bertrand has published over 60 books, including his acclaimed "The Earth From Above," which has sold more than 3.5 million copies world-

wide. At a time when everybody is questioning the future of our environment, and on an island of just eight square miles where environmental questions have become crucial to its development, it seemed pertinent for us to invite this militant environmentalist, who through his GoodPlanet Foundation launched in 2005, has dedicated his life to the goal of making the environment an important issue in our collective consciousness," explains Didier Bensa, president of the association, Saint B' Art. "In spite of an extremely busy schedule, Yann Arthus-Bertrand, who was commissioned to make the official film for the International Year Of Forests, in 2011, accepted our invita-

tion quite spontaneously and looks forward to the exchange of ideas," adds Bensa, who has known the photographer for 30 years. During the literary festival, Arthus-Bertrand will visit the junior high, and attend the screening of his film, Home, on Saturday, April 2. This rights-free film, produced by Luc Besson and financed by the Pinault group, was seen by 20 million people worldwide when it premiered on June 5, 2009 on World Environment Day. The film is about the state of our planet and what mankind must do to help it survive. On Sunday, April 3, the closing day of the festival, Arthus-Bertrand will also sign a selection of 10 books, of which six are aimed at young readers. The festival also features three additional authors who will meet with students: for the kindergarten and elementary school, Chinese painter and illustrator, Chen Jiang Hong, who has created numerous works for children, and Belgian children's author and illustrator Pierrick Bisinski. Writer Malika Ferdjough will meet with junior high classes.

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# Ulf Nordfjell: Sustainability Is A Must



Swedish landscape architect and botanist Ulf Nordfjell is back in Saint Barth as a special guest of the Swedish Design Center in Gustavia, where his book on gardening and some of his copper garden tables and galvanized planters are on display. In addition, a look at his website, nordfjellcollection.se, shows the elegant simplicity of his winning garden designs and furniture.



But there is much more to Nordfjell: his soul searches for the best possible solution to every garden, with sustainability at the root of his nature. In a lecture at the Brigantine in Gustavia on March 2, Nordfjell addressed some of the issues near to his heart: "You have to take into consideration the differences in climate and environmental themes," he notes, referring to such variables as frost in Sweden or a lack of water and good soil in St Barth and other tropical zones. "You have to unite the ideas of garden architecture and horticulture," he explains, "and know how to use plants, those that are native and non-native to the island. And when

importing plants the should be controlled by horticultural specialists to be sure not to bring bugs or disease with them."

For Nordfjell, planting a garden is akin to storytelling, "like a house tells a story, with a mix of architectural styles," he says, "a garden has to tell a story as well, in order to make it personal." In choosing plants that will thrive in a garden here, Nordfjell suggests looking around at the native plants that survive on their own in the wild. "When you go out to Colombier, you see some beautiful native plants. Take a walk to see what's natural and you'll know what to do with your garden," he notes. "I would

love to do a modern garden here, blending the island's Swedish influence and a contemporary Caribbean style, with low maintenance design that would still look good in 25 or 50 years."

From public parks to private gardens, Nordfjell has put his stamp on many major projects, marrying biodiversity and sustainability with intelligent design. "Everyone is thinking about the environment, and people are beginning to grow their own fruits and vegetables and herbs around the world," he notes. "Here you have to maintain the local flora and not bring in too many aggressive plants. It would be better to encourage nurseries here to grow native plants and make sure they continue to exist."

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## BKMH:

# MAJOR WORK NEARS COMPLETION



The major work is nearly finished at the site in Delmas 31, a suburb of Port-au-Prince in Haiti, where BKMH (Bay Kout Men Haiti), an association of artisans from Saint Barth has been volunteering for the past few months to build a school for as many as 500 students.

The six classroom bungalows have been built, and two of them have been covered (our photo) with metal roofing sent by container in early November and stored until early last week. The masonry for the plumbing systems is also in place and a plumber is onsite to hook up the water from a large cistern dug under one of the buildings to collect rainwater from all of the roofs. Adrien Gaume Bechet, president of BKMH, estimates that the majority of this work will be finished within a month, leaving just the painting and finishing work to be done, then comes the setting up of the classrooms themselves: "This was not planned initially, but it makes sense that after building the classrooms that the students are as comfortable as possible," Bechet explains.

### A PROJECT WITHOUT BORDERS

Word-of-mouth travels fast and the news of this unusual project has spread. BKMH was contacted by an Italian humanitarian organization that has offered financial support. Then last week a carpenter from France, who knew about the BKMH project via the association's blog, came over to volunteer his services and lend a hand to the team from Saint Barth at the work site. France Volontaires, a French humanitarian organization, also contacted BKMH and offered the help of its volunteers who are already in Haiti. But due to their lack of necessary skills they were not retained for this phase of the project. Last but not least, a representative of the French Kiwanis Club presented a check for 6,000 Euros to BKMH last Thursday evening.

At this time, when the anticipated reconstruction of Port-au-Prince has barely gotten underway, the BKMH project has raised quite a bit of interest: "It is true that our project is advancing at the rhythm we desired, which is not the case for many other reconstruction sites. I think this is due to the fact that we worked "à la Saint Barth," on our own, with solid experience in coming up with plan B when needed," explained Adrien Gaume Bechet. The site itself also contributed to the success of the project "It is a closed, secure area, just 10 minutes from the airport, with logistics put into place so that the work could advance quickly," he added.
