# CHIKUNGUNYA EPIDEMIC CONTINUES

The epidemic of chikungunya, a tropical virus transmitted by *Aedes Aegypti* mosquitoes, continues in both Saint Barth and Saint Martin. A report published on January 24 confirmed 45 cases in Saint Barth and close to 400 in Saint Martin, where the epidemic started in early December.

Beware of mosquitoes! Especially those with white stripes, the *Aedes Aegypti* mosquito that carries the dengue and chikungunya viruses. Especially as an epidemic of chikungunya is progressing in Saint Barth and Saint Martin, where the first cases were identified in early December. The January 24 report by the Antilles Guyana Epidemiology Center confirms 45 cases in Saint Barth, although there could be more once results are received from the lab in Marseilles. In Saint Martin, 393 cases have been confirmed,



with a new report expected at the end of the week. To avoid getting mosquito bites, health authorities recommend—as much as possible—to wear long clothing in the evenings, and to use insect repellent regularly. The symptoms of chikungunya—high fever, overall aches—are similar to those of dengue. The difference with chikungunya is localized pain in the joints. In case of doubt, it is important to visit your doctor. Please protect yourself and have a great stay in Saint Barth!

## SPRAYING AGAINST CHIKUNGUNYA

In its fight against proliferation of mosquitoes carrying the chikungunya virus—which has reached epidemic proportions in Saint Martin—the Collectivity will continue spraying insecticides around the island as follows:

- Thursday, January 30: St Jean, Lorient, and Saline.
- Friday, January 31: Grand Fond, Toiny, Petit and Grand Cul-de-Sac.
- Monday, February 3 : Marigot, Pointe Milou, Vitet, and Camaruche.

It is recommended to leave windows and doors open during the spraying. Also be sure to empty any stagnant water around the house, even in vases and flower pots.

## SAINT BARTH RED CROSS: REPORT ON 2013 ACTIVITIES

The territorial delegation of the Red Cross has published a report detailing its activities throughout 2013. Thanks to generous donations, the delegation was able to send 10,000 euros to the Margency children's hospital in Val-d'Oise that treats children—primarily from overseas territories—who suffer from serious illnesses. The funds help house their families. In a joint action with the Saint Barth Lions Club, 77 cartons of clothing for adults and children were sent to Haiti, along with orthopedic and neo-natal equipment, and even some tents. The Red Cross was able to share a container sent by the Lions Club. Eight bags of clothing along with some toys were sent to the small island of

Marie Galante, in collaboration with a doctor who works there. Over the past year, the Red Cross organized a “vestiboutique,” or used clothing sale that raised 2000 euros for the association, Un Espoir Pour Loucas. Another donation of toys went to Dr. Olivo, director of home hospitalization services for Saint Martin and Saint Barthélemy; and in collaboration with the Rotary Club of Saint Barth, a donation of 3000 euros was made to “Les Zandolis,” an association that organizes activities for kids, so that the center could stay open all summer. Also in association with the Rotary Club, 3000 euros worth of equipment was donated to the association Saint-Barth Handicap, including


four special chairs that allow handicapped people to bathe. In addition, the Saint Barth delegation of the Red Cross was able to help finance the needs of its sister organization in Saint Martin, allotting 3000 euros to help purchase first-aid equipment. And in Saint Barth, the Red Cross invested 1800 euros in the training of a first aid instructor, while they also spent 9000 euros to purchase and install three new defibrillators which have been placed in Colombier, Saline and Grand-Fond. In publishing this report, the local branch of the Red Cross took the opportunity to “thank all of its donors for their generosity.” And to send its “best wishes” for the New Year to everyone on the island.

# Windsurfing Time!

Friday, January 31-Sunday, February 2; the 3rd edition of the Saint-Barth Fun Cup features a three-day windsurfing competition that includes everyone from top amateurs to world champions, such as Björn Dunkerbeck, a multiple world champion and Antoine Questel, a rider from Saint-Barth, and double French slalom champion. Great racing on the horizon!



**W**ith registration on January 30 and three days of racing on January 31-February 2, this competition features amateurs as well as the best windsurfers in the world, with 80 participants expected this year. Frenchman Antoine Albeau, a multiple world champion and an exceptional athlete named “sailor of the year” in 2010 won the first edition, in 2012. Last year the glory went to local champion Antoine Questel, double French slalom champion and co-organizer of the event with Arnaud Daniel. He will have to defend his title against some of the best racers in the world: Alexandre Cousin and Pierre Mortefon from France; or Taty Frans from Bonaire. Or the living legend of the sport, Björn Dunkerbeck and his 40 world champion titles earned in all variations of windsurfing (slalom, vague, free-style, course racing). Among the

women, Delphine Cousin, French slalom and world champion in 2013 (as well as Antoine Questel’s girlfriend) is expected, as well as five-time free-style world champion, Sarah Quita Offringa from Aruba.

Needless to say, the competition will be stiff. For these professionals, the Saint-Barth Fun Cup is at the start of their season, providing an opportunity to warm-up for the PWA (Professional Windsurfers Association) world championships. For the amateurs, many who come from the four corners of the Caribbean such as Guadeloupe, Martinique, and the Virgin Islands, this is a chance to race against the very best. And maybe even beat them in at least one race, if not the entire competition.

The 80 racers are divided into six categories: “Kids,” for those under the age of 14 (there are six

youngsters registered for a shorter race on just Saturday and Sunday); “Junior” for those participants under 20; “Women;” and “Grand Masters” (over 45). Many also have the chance to shine in the “Amateur” category as well as the “Overall” standings, which will most likely be dominated by the pros (those who participate in the PWA world championships)

For three days, a race village will be set up on the beach in Saint Jean. The organizers has planned numerous activities, include a nocturnal free-style exhibition (lit by spotlights) on Saturday, February 1, which can be seen La Plage restaurant (Tom Beach Hotel). There is also a free concert on the dock in Gustavia on Sunday evening February 2, after the awards ceremony at 8pm.



For their 3rd edition, the organizers of the Saint-Barth Fun Cup have gone all orange, with this bright color—already an element on the shirts of prior editions—now used for all the goodies given to participants: t-shirts, racing jerseys, bags, stickers for their sails with the names of the main sponsors. And the beach in Saint Jean will be covered with tents and flags of the same shade of orange. “Impossible for a racer to head to the wrong beach at the end of a race,” joke Antoine Questel and Arnaud Daniel.

# A Return To Nature



“**B**efore I could speak, I could draw,” explains Lola Montes Schnabel. As far as art is concerned, she certainly learned at the knee of an excellent master. She is the oldest daughter of American filmmaker and neo-expressionist painter Julian Schnabel (whose films include *Basquiat*, *Before Night Falls*, and *The Diving Bell and the Butterfly*) and clothing designer Jacqueline Beurang. Lola Montes Schnabel was born in 1981, in New York, in

the heart of the avant-garde movement. She grew up in the Chelsea Hotel, where various artists such as Bob Dylan, Sid Vicious, Janis Joplin (who died in 1970), and Andy Warhol all lived at one point or another. With her father, Lola learned to paint, discovered photography and the movies. She spent her free time experimenting in a lifestyle unfettered by the constraints society can impose. A liberty that might offer its own dangers, cause its own torments. Painting

became the means to express these sentiments. If Lola's canvases resemble those of her father, it is by their sharp, sometimes violent palette, which is remarkably harmonious. But Lola's work reveals her unique, personal talent. She graduated from Cooper Union, an art school in Lower Manhattan, in 2008, and has already had exhibits in galleries in New York,

Los Angeles, among others. And now in Saint Barth, at Edén Rock Gallery thanks to the association, Art Saint-Barth, run by Philippe Combres and Jenny Mannerheim.

# “BEFORE I COULD SPEAK, I COULD DRAW”

A Q&A with Lola Montes Schnabel

*Please give us a brief introduction about yourself and your background.*

*What brought you to this point?*  
My mother (clothing designer Jacqueline Beurang) is Belgian. Her mother is the love of my life, a champion horse jumper, pilot, and nurse. My father (painter and filmmaker Julian Schnabel) is of Romanian and Czech-decent, born in Brooklyn. They met in the early 80's and looks as if they found one another. I am the first born that came out of that love.

I would choose these people as friends even if we were not related. Before I could speak, I could draw. And it was an inherent part of my very being to communicate visually. My mother Jacqueline recalls that she could leave me for hours and I would be talking to myself,

staring at my hands or what ever was around. Staring off into space. I was that kid who would build worlds and play for hours by myself, drawing hundreds of pictures, and it never stopped.


*You had your first solo show in New York at The Hole in 2011 and went to a silent retreat in India afterwards. You are now painting in the woods, away from New York. How important are these experiences to your art?*

The choice to become zero while one's work is being displayed was an experiment of disassociation. I had done as much as I could and the paintings had to be left in the showroom without me standing beside them. Who I am became a subject I wanted to question by becoming a number with no per-

sonal identification to my situation. It opened up a space for new images and I am grateful to have found the explosive tool of meditation through the process.

*What kinds of images are you interested in creating?*

Images that describe a world within a world, or a space to wonder... The spirit world for instance, it's invisible yet it exists on a metaphysical plane. Where shapes and light and movement, the breathlessness of a feather, or brushstrokes intertwine with color, mythical symbols, a little of to the side as in a dream and with a kind of musical flow to the detail of that place all becoming one meditation. I like to inject my art with my life force. The potential of feeling!

# ZYDECO AND JAZZ: CLOSING CONCERTS AT ST BARTH MUSIC FESTIVAL

**A**fter some fabulous classical music, from Baroque to opera, the St Barth Music Festival closes its 30th anniversary season with the upbeat rhythms of zydeco and jazz. On Saturday, February 1 at 8pm, the festival moves to AJOE's outdoor venue in Lorient for a concert of Baton Rouge Jazz & Zydeco, featuring bassist, composer, and arranger, Roland Guerin, who is a return guest at the Music Festival. He will perform with Sean Ardoin on accordion and vocals, Chris Atkins on guitar, Derek Douget on saxophone, Aaron Goldberg on piano, and Joe Dyson on drums.

In addition to being the leader on six recordings of his own, Guerin has appeared on over 100 albums worldwide, plays bass with New Orleans legend Allen Toussaint, and contributed music to the score of the documentary film "Historically Black." His father's family is from Martinique while he has Creole roots in the Lafayette/St Martinsville area of Louisiana as well. "We're going to mix it up in Saint Barth, with some zydeco, folk, and jazz," Guerin says. "We want to explore the groove of zydeco, share the feeling and the excitement of what makes this music what it is. All of the musicians are great, they can all solo and play melodies, so we can stretch out and have

fun with it, and expand on everybody's talents, taking it to the next level."

The closing concert of the 2014 festival will be on Sunday, February 2 at 5pm at the Anglican Church in Gustavia, where the John Ellis Band takes center stage. Also a festival veteran, saxophonist John Ellis, who also plays ocarina and other reed instruments, Ellis returns with Joe Dyson on percussion, Aaron Goldberg on piano, and Reuben Rogers on bass. "You never know what he's going to bring," says Jill DeBroff, one of the festival organizers. "It's very exciting." Two days of joyful, easy listening!



# ED GUDENAS GRAZED BY WINAIR PLANE



**P**hotographer Ed Gudenas is a very lucky man! An American photographer who recently published the book “St Barth XL,” Gudenas was hit by a Winair plane that was coming in for a landing on Friday afternoon, January 24, at approximately 4:30pm. He was standing on the harbor-side of the road at the top of the hill past the airport (and not atop a car as reported by some), having pedaled his bike up there earlier

in the afternoon to take photos of planes landing. People on the plane are said to have felt it “hit” something. An ambulance was called to take Gudenas to the hospital in Gustavia.

By 7pm he was back at Le Select having a glass of rosé, with stitches in his forehead and eyebrow, as he fell face forward onto the ground, but was lucky not have broken any teeth. “Only in St. Barth can you start

at Le Select, take photos of planes landing, get hit, take an ambulance to the hospital, and be back at Le Select a few hours later,” Gudenas reports on the sbhonline forum.

“The ambulance crew was super. I had ridden my bike to the circle and they locked it up until it could be fetched the next morning,” he says. “My camera was destroyed, but I had insurance on it. I also paid \$27 for travel insurance until April 1, which will cover the medical expenses. And all of my friends here have been super great. Even Marius from Le Select who has his own eye problems spoke with me about his concern. I was standing on the ground just behind and to the north of the directional sign on the harbor side of the circle. That plane was low. One inch to the left or higher and no

more photos for me.” His new motto is “Better Ed Than Dead.”

Later that evening, Gudenas went to Eddy’s for dinner: “A nice French couple from NYC were at the table next to us. He recognized me because he is the one that took the photo of the plane just before it smacked me. I was knocked out for a while and do not remember all that happened. But, I do know that people in St. Barth are great!”

Gudenas adds: “As far as I know I was in an unrestricted area. I have never entered a restricted area to take a photo. There are signs on the other side of the circle restricting access, but nothing that I saw where I was... My guess is that changes may be made in the future.”

# AG2R-LA MONDIALE: SIX FORMER WINNERS ON THE ROSTER

**O**n April 6 the boats in the Transat Ag2r La Mondiale will set sail for Saint Barth from Concarneau, France, with the leaders expected to arrive approximately three weeks later. As of January 22, there were 13 two-person teams pre-registered, comprising celebrated sailors, six of whom have already won a prior edition of this challenging transatlantic race that takes place every two years.

These former winners include Gildas Morvan and Charlie Dalin, champions of most recent edition in 2012, as well as Fabien Delahaye, who took first place in

2010. Not to mention top dogs Kito de Pavant in 2006, Jean Le Cam in 1994, and Michel Desjoyeaux in 1992, for the debut of the Transat Ag2r, which set sail from Lorient, France. Desjoyeaux returns 22 years later, after 16 years absence in this race. His teammate aboard Bretagne-Crédit Mutuel Performance will be young sailor Corentin Horeau. Kito de Pavant, who has spent a lot of time training on an Ag2r Figaro to get back in the groove, will be sailing with Gwen Gbick on Made In Midi. Le Cam and Gildas Mahé will be aboard Interface Concept, with Delahaye and Yoann Richomme on Skipper Macif, but since their

boat is still under construction they will double their training efforts as of March. In the meantime, Delahaye is schedule to participate in Sailing Arabia The Tour.

Other acclaimed sailors on the list are Erwan Tabarly and Thierry Chabagny, the skipper of Gédimat, who has come in sixth on three different occasions in the Ag2r La Mondiale:

“The results are determined long before the start of the race,” he indicates, while making sure his boat is in the best possible condition for the ocean crossing.

During the flight Jeanne noted the discrete elegance of the flight attendant, who turned out to be Ineke, the wife of our journalist. And the bonds of friendship were forged. And as we write these lines, Jeanne is on her way to St Barth by sea, sailing from Spain on the legendary “Zeewoelf” with her son at the helm, and Philippe and Ineke are keeping a sharp eye on the horizon with the binoculars from the Domaine de la Côte Sauvage, where Jeanne invited them as her guests for a few days. They hope to see their boats before they return to France. Since Radio Saint Barth transmits RFI, you can hear Philippe Lecaplain every weekend online, or via podcast on the RFI website, where you can listen to his two programs, “Accents du monde” and “Dimanche Politique.”*


