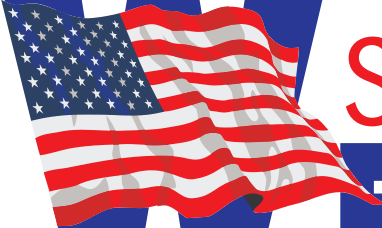

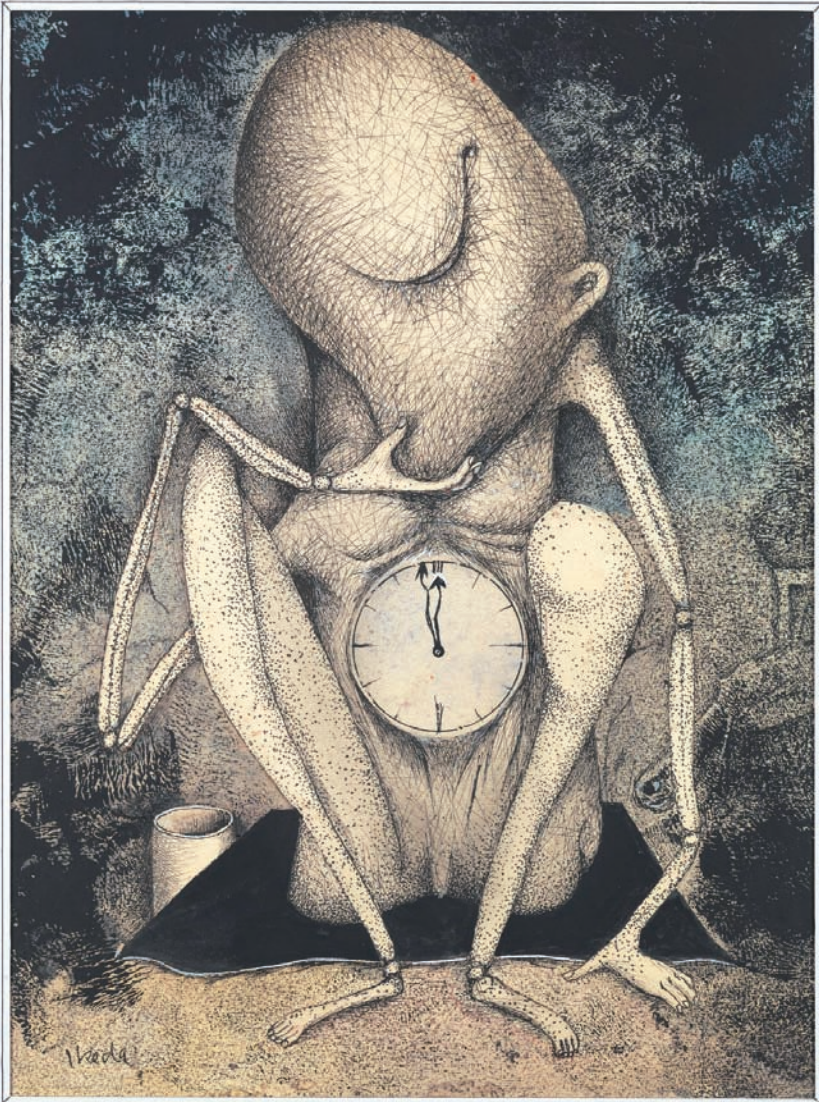

TATSUO IKEDA AT FERGUS McCAFFREY

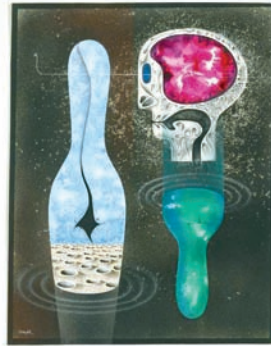
Fergus McCaffrey, St. Barth, presents an exhibition of works on paper created between 1958 and 2008 by the Japanese artist Tatsuo Ikeda. This is the artist's first exhibition at Fergus McCaffrey, in the new gallery in Gustavia now through January 31, 2015.

Ikeda was born in Imari, Saga, in 1928. During World War II, he was trained as a kamikaze pilot in the Imperial Japanese Navy Air Service, but by good fortune was never deployed. However, his wartime experience of seeing his fellow pilots being dispatched to their deaths in the name of their divine Emperor scarred Ikeda deeply and drove him to become an antiauthoritarian artist after the war ended in 1945.

After the war, Ikeda strongly disagreed with the decision made by the politicians of the time to keep the Emperor in place, and

expressed his negative feelings on this issue. His belief that the imperial regime should have ended in the aftermath of the Second World War was reflected in his artistic practice. Ikeda responded to the absurdity and contradictions of the situation by turning to and finding inspiration in Surrealist philosophy.

As Ikeda couldn't afford proper art supplies, his first drawings from the early 1950s were made with pen. Works from the 1950s feature delicately rendered images of traumatized, distorted, and mutated animal and human forms often tor-

tured by mechanical devices. Critical and satirical works targeted the post-war politicians. During 1960s, Ikeda worked on the series Oval Space, in which he captured a dually focused worldview, and also Toy World, that portrayed the world as a bizarre toy-like construction. In the 1970s, Ikeda added airbrush to his repertory to produce fantastically rendered works that address Hinduism, biological forms, and sexuality. Ikeda continues his visual innovation to this day at the great age of 86.

Ikeda's first solo exhibition was in 1954 at Yoseido Gallery in Ginza, Tokyo, and he has continued to work and

exhibit actively for the last 60 years. His practice has evolved over time to include painting and sculpture; he also actively engages in theatrical works and film. Until recently, Ikeda's work was largely unknown in the West; however, he came to broader attention in the exhibition Tokyo 1955-1970: A New Avant-Garde at The Museum of Modern Art, New York (2012), which included his work prominently. He was also featured in the documentary film ANPO (2010), directed by Linda Hoaglund, which examined the relationship between the Japan-U.S. Security Treaty, war, and art.

January

WELCOMING THE NEW YEAR

Abbott Brown's 96' Frers yacht, Symmetry, with Australian skipper Ross Kleiman, at the helm, had the fastest time around the island in the New Year's Eve Regatta on December 31, 2013: 2 hours, 1 minute, 18 seconds. The record of 1 hour, 32 minutes, 7 seconds, set by Visione in 2004, still stands.

February

HERITAGE: AND IF WE DID AN INVENTORY?

Concerned about the island's heritage, the association Saint-Barth Essentiel invited cultural curators Céline Frémaux and Yolande Vragar, from Guyana and Guadeloupe respectively, to discuss the importance of creating an inventory of one's heritage at a conference at the Capitainerie, Wednesday, February 12.

"To have a solid knowledge of one's heritage is very important to avoid that any vestiges of the past, from buildings to even a landscape created by man, be erased without a trace. Never to be seen again," explains Frémaux. At the rate at which concrete is being poured in Saint Barth, it is not a bad idea to record what was once found underneath.

March

WHAT A CARNIVAL!



The Carnival tradition continued in Saint Barth, with a Mardi Gras parade on Tuesday, March 4. There may have been with large troupes this year but still quite a spectacle as the parade danced it way though the streets of Gustavia. Feeling hot, hot, hot!

SAINT BARTH BUCKET



After three days of great racing, Marie, the 180' ketch owned by Ed Bosarge, was the winner of the 2014 Saint Barth Bucket, which took place on March 28-30. Marie had participated once before in 2011. This year's charitable donation from the Bucket was a check for 20,000 Euros to the Saint Joseph elementary school in Lorient to improve their facilities for kids.

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NEW LOGO EMPHASIZES ART

The new logo for Saint Barth, as commissioned by the Territorial Tourism Committee (CTTSB) to distinguish our island from competing destinations, was presented on Sunday, March 30, on the Quai du Wall House during the awards ceremony for the Bucket. Three letters are all it takes to put an accent on ART in Saint Barth—from the art of good living to an accent on the visual and performing arts.

April

BOOKS IN FOCUS

Once again this year, the association Saint-B'Art put reading in the spotlight during the Book Festival organized from March 31-April 6. The accent was on young readers, with guests including writer Marie-Aude Murail, as well as author/illustrators Emmanuelle Houdart and Anais Massini, who all met with the students in the island's schools. A highlight of the festival was the traditional book exchange on the Quai du Wall House.

TRANSAT AG2R-LA MONDIALE

15 teams of two set sail from Concarneau on April 6 in the 12th edition of the Transat Ag2r-La Mondiale,



with five previous winners in the race and raising the level of competition to new levels. After 22 days, 6 hours, 17 minutes, and 59 seconds at sea, Gwénolé Gahinet and Paul Meilhat (Safran-Guy Cotton) took top honors. 1h, 6mn, and 53s later, Fabien Delahaye and Yoann Richomme (Skipper Macif) took second place, after a hot duel with Roland Jourdain and Martin Le Pape (La Cornouaille) as they approached Gustavia, but Alexia Barrier and Laurent Pellecuer (30 Corsaires) sailed past to secure their place on the podium.

LES VOILES DE SAINT BARTH



The 5th Edition of Les Voiles de Saint-Barth unfurled its sails on April 14-19, with 70 boats and close to 1000 sailors expected. The winners in each of nine classes proved themselves in every type of sailing possible, with unpredictable sea and wind conditions. Caol Ila R was the big winner in the Maxi Class.

OETKER TAKES OVER MANAGEMENT OF EDEN ROCK

As Saint Barth continues to feed the appetite for luxury hotel groups, Oetker added the Eden Rock to its prestigious collection. A contract was signed with David Mathews on April 12, giving the management of the five-star hotel in Saint Jean to the German company Jane and David Mathews remain the owners of the hotel. Several months earlier the Oetker

CINEMA IN THE SPOTLIGHT



For almost 20 years, the Saint Barth Film Festival has shown films by Caribbean directors or with Caribbean themes. The 19th edition of the festival took place on April 25-30, with an accent on Cuban cinema, including three feature films, *Una Noche* by Lucy Mulloy, *Melaza* by Carlos Lechuga, and *Yo Se De Un Lugar*, a documentary by Beat Borter. In addition, close to a dozen other films were presented at AJOE in Lorient, at the Wall House Museum, and on the beach in Flamands. With a director, producer, or actor to present each film. Lights, Camera, Action!

May

SOUVENIRS OF SAINT-BARTH ON STAGE

SB Artists, a non-profit association, presented a play about Saint Barth in days of yore, written and performed by native islanders, in Creole. The play pre-

miered on May 9 at the Théâtre du Paradis and was a triumph!

For three evenings the theatre was filled, right before the start of the 13th edition of the Theatre Festival



also organized by SB Artists, with Michèle Kokosowski, Yves Marc, Antoine Duléry, Ali Bougheraba, Raoul Fernandez, and Julien Touati among the invited guests.

June

URBAN PLANNING MAP: ONE MORE TIME

The administrative court rejected the last attempt at a planning map for the island in the fall of 2013. So back to square one for the creation of a zoning map for Saint Barth. The territorial council attacked the project at their June 6 meeting, with new calculations for the SHON (overall surface of construction), and boundaries for protected green zones. Or to add to the urban planning code a permit allowing division of a piece of land. Or extending the range of construction requiring just a simple declaration of the work to be done, rather than a building permit, or to integrate national reforms in case of litigation. And to make sure the next attempt at a zoning map is open for consultation by the public and professionals.

July

MUSIC FROM THE CARIBBEAN

If it's July it's time for Caribbean music! The 9th edition of the SB Jam Festival offered a tour of the Caribbean via its great musical genres. From July 11-14, the stage on the main dock in Gustavia featured such stars as

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Marc Ferdinand and Luc Léandry, as well as Karibos and Magnum Band. The festival concluded with the traditional Bastille Day fireworks on July 14.

August

NEIGHBORHOOD FÊTES



Summertime and the island neighborhoods host their local festivities. Starting with that of the windward side of the island, organized by AJOE in Lorient on August 2 & 3, with activities all weekend from a mass in honor of sailors followed by the traditional procession to the sea for a blessing. On Saturday, August 16 and Sunday, August 17, the fete was in Gustavia, organized by the association The Youngz. Events included a singing competition on the dock, as well as the pre-selection of candidates for Miss Saint Barth 2015. Next came the island's fete of St Barthélemy on August 24, and the Fete of Saint-Louis in Corossol, organized par ALC on August 25.

FATHER KAZE LEAVES, FATHER ROSSI TAKES HIS PLACE

The Catholic priest for Saint Barthélemy, Father Eugène Kaze left the parish for that of Sainte Anne in Guadeloupe, as requested by the diocese. A farewell event was held on August 29. His successor, Father Fiorenzo Rossi had already presided over mass for the Fete of St Barthélemy, and assumed his new post definitely as of October.

MICHEL MAGRAS RE-ELECTED SENATOR

The senator's seat for Saint Barthélemy was up for grabs during the senatorial elections held on Sunday, September 28. And no surprise, the seat once again went to Michel Magras, for a second term. No surprise, as in theory Magras could count on the 16 votes of the majority party of which he is a member in the Territorial Council, as compared to his opponent Benoit Chauvin. But a small surprise in the number of votes garnered by Chauvin: four. Which means that two members of Saint-Barth d'Abord voted for Chauvin. Even if we add the two blank votes, four members of the council broke party lines for this election. Not an issue for who will continue his tenure at the Palais du Luxembourg in Paris, for the next six years. Or until 2020, and as a member of the UMP, once again the majority as the Senate returned to the right during these last elections. Four weeks later, Michel Magras was elected president of the overseas senatorial delegation.

October

SURPRISED BY GONZALO!



The morning before, there was little attention being paid to a seemingly harmless tropical depression. 24 hours later, on Monday, October 13, the storm had become a category 1 hurricane as it swept past the Northern Islands. Its name was Gonzalo. Not a major one as hurricanes go, but one that took everyone by surprise. Especially those with boats in the harbor, who took a pretty hard hit, with 42 vessels sunk, drifted away, or damaged. Fortunately no lives were lost, but 20 or so of these boats were year-round homes for their owners—including families with children—who lost everything in the course of a day. Their plight mobilized a sense of solidarity resulting in donations and other aid. The catastrophe brought French Overseas Minister George Pau-Langevin on her first official visit to Saint Barth on October 26.

THE ISLAND'S NEW CAT SCAN



It's true: Saint Barth has a CAT scan. This cutting-edge medical equipment was purchased with donations collected by the FEMUR, and inaugurated on October 17, to be put into service as quickly as possible as it had been delivered last April 26. It is installed in the new radiology center run by the doctors Bartoli, on the lower level of the EHPAD. The Collectivity had to obtain authorization from the Regional Health Agency (ARS) for the scanner, which is managed by the Groupement de Coopération Sanitaire (GCS), comprised of the Collectivity, the De Bruyn Hospital, and the radiology center. All that was needed to put the machine in service was authorization from the nuclear safety authority (ASN), which controls radiological protection.

A FESTIVAL FOR THE TASTEBUDS



After a trial run in 2013, The Taste of Saint Barth held its first official edition October 31-November 4, with seven illustrious chefs invited to work in the kitchens of various hotels on the island: Jean-Georges Vongerichten at the Eden Rock, Amandine Chaignot at the Christopher Hotel, Jean-Jacques Nogier at La at Tom Beach Hotel, La Plage, Daniel Berlind at Cheval Blanc Saint-Barth Isle de France, La Case de l'Isle, Hideaki Matsuo, three Michelin stars, at Le Toiny, Thomas Troigros at Le Sereno, and Jérôme Nutille,

two Michelin stars, at Bartoloméo at the Guanahani. Other restaurants got in the act for lunches for special events, while cooking and bartending competitions rounded out the schedule.

SAINT BARTH SALUTES SWEDEN

November 8 & 9 was a weekend to salute Sweden with Piteå Day celebrating the twinning of the island with this northern Swedish city, and a general recognition of the continual links between Saint Barth and Sweden, which owned the island from 1784-1878. A large Swedish delegation was present including Peter Roslund, the mayor of Piteå, and members of the Friends Of Saint Barth Association in Piteå, and its president Thomas Wallstén, as well as the Saint-Barthélemy Sällskapet, and its president Roger Richter.

November

PERROTIN GALLERY SHOW IN SAINT BARTH

Is Saint Barth in the same orbit as Art Basel Miami Beach? That's the thought of art mogul Larry Gagosian, who presents leading artists during high season, in partnership with the Eden Rock Gallery. This year, the celebrated Perrotin Gallery was also part of the scene, as the association Art Saint-Barth, convinced Emmanuel Perrotin and the artist Kaws to show his latest works at the Eden Rock Gallery from November 28- December 25. Another example of the ART in Saint Barth!

December

EHPAD INAUGURATED

The EHPAD (senior citizen home) was baptized after doctor Louis Vialenc, and officially inaugurated on Saturday, December 20. It will house 30 seniors, primarily women, as of mid-January. The first to move in are those who were already living at the De Bruyn Hospital.

JASPER JOHNS AT TERRITORIAL MUSEUM TERRITORIAL

Paying tribute to celebrated artists who have created work in Saint Barth or on nearby islands, the association Saint-Barth Isle d'Art organized its first exhibit, a retrospective of 24 works by American pop artist and master printmaker Jasper Johns, at the Territorial Museum. The opening was on December 28 in the newly redesigned museum whose concept was created by American architect Bill Katz.
