#### SAINT BARTH DEPENDENT ON TOURISM

t is a real mystery what Saint Barth would have become if a certain American clientele hadn't made it one of its favorite vacation destinations. A study published the IEDOM (French Overseas Central Bank) on Wednesday, January 28, reveals what these American visitors and friends bring to the economy of the island. The Guadeloupe office of the IEDOM is responsible for overseeing the stability of the banking system and produces regular reports on our economic health.

This new report centers exclusively on tourism in Saint Barthélemy. "The main office in Paris is equally interested in tourism in the other overseas territories.' explains Bérangère Callamand, of IEDOM. The fact that our island's economy exists thanks to tourism isn't a scoop, but the IEDOM study points out that our level dependence tourists breaks a11 records, with 37% of employees directly involved in tourism from hotels to restaurants—or tourist-related services, not to mention additional indirect employment generated by tourism. This compares to a 6% average in France's overseas departments such as Martinique (less than 5%) and Guadeloupe, or 30% in Saint Martin.

Local politicians are aware that our island depends almost on a mono-industry, while commerce and construction also generate economic activity. But, as the IEDOM points out, tourism exerts "significant effects" on these other activities, especially real estate and building. In fact, the building trades count for almost 15% of the businesses on the island. And the fact that tourism in Saint Barth is destined for a high-end clientele did not escape the IEDOM. This clientele has the means to fill the rather unusual range of accommodations on the island, composed of 70% villas and only 30% hotels. A few years ago, the committee tourism (CTTSB) did an inventory of 635 seasonal rental villas with a capacity of 1,700 bedrooms. This type of lodging requires numerous high-end services, car rentals, maintenance. etc. The hotel capacity, or 544 rooms in 2013. has not evolved much according to IEDOM. But these are almost all luxury establishments, or four- and five-star hotels, which are more expensive and lucrative, accounting for close to two-thirds of the total rooms

According to figures from the CTTSB as reported by the IEDOM, the average prices for a hotel room in Saint Barth is 682 euros, while the revenue per room is 355 euros, or four to five times higher than the rest of the Caribbean. The clientele of Saint Barth remains at least 60% American, notes the IEDOM, whose data once again comes from the CTTSB, while the European clientele, Russians included, is less than 30%. The South Americans, targeted by the tourism committee and travel agents, are less numerous at just over 10%.



## SAINT-BARTH ESSENTIEL INVITED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE GEOTREF PROGRAM

o evaluate the potential of geothermal energy in the West Indies, a joint program called GEOT-REF has been set up. At the end of last year, the program started with an exploratory intended to last for two years. The goal is to identify faults in the marine sub-strata as potential sources of geothermal energy. What happens is that water penetrates these faults and is heated by active volcanoes. This hot water or its steam is capable of turning turbines that then produce electricity. An example of this is already operational in Bouillante, Guadeloupe.

The goal of this program is the development of new technology and innovative tools for the production of this kind of energy close to potential new markets in the Caribbean and Latin America. This will allow


businesses, such as Teranov, Kinova, and Magnitudes, to position themselves as leaders in the field. To lead the explorations in the waters around Guadeloupe in the first phase of the project, the catamaran Antea will set sail in the next few days.

The scientists aboard include Yves Mazabraud, a geologist from the Antilles Guyana University (UAG) who is responsible for the GEOTREF program. He has invited Michel Chevaly from Saint-Barth Essentiel to help collect data and make precise measurements of the depth of the water, as well as record the magnetism, whose variations confirm the presence of the faults.

"The association, Saint-Barth Essentiel, is especially concerned by the production of renewable energy since on our island has at least 95% of its electricity produced by fossil fuel," explains Chevaly. "Admittedly, the GEOT-REF program, which represents sustainable energy from geothermal reservoirs, is not directly applicable on our island as we are not close enough to an active volcano. Thus the potential heat given off under the water is lower," notes the secretary of the association. "But we are nonetheless very interested in this program. technological advances or new discoveries could change the situation in the future." Mazabraud is expected to once again visit the island as part of his research project, and Saint-Barth Essentiel has already asked him to make a report on his work to date.












To take advantage of this opportunity, the hotel has opened its recruitment to people in a handicapped situation, as is spelled out in their job offers. They have also engaged someone to identify


employees who might have a handicap by talking with them, "as all handicaps are not visible," explains Laurent Robillard, the director of LB Développement Outre-mer, a human resources consulting film whose goal is to help those with handicaps find suitable work. "Barely 3% of handicapped persons are in a wheel chair," adds Robillard.

The Christopher Hotel called upon the services of the firm, LB DOM, to get its message across and to change people's opinion about handicaps. To this end, the employees of the Christopher were invited to take a quiz on



Tuesday, February 3. One of the ideas that have to be overcome is

that "most people with handicaps are born that way. But that's not true," sighs Robillard. "Most frequently handicaps develop after the age of 16," he adds, pointing out that there is still a lot to do on the island to get all businesses to take this responsibility. And improve the relationship between employers and candidates with a handicap. To help facilitate those relationships, LB DOM has opened a website called Handi'-Dom (www.handidom.com). ## CARNIVAL ON TUESDAY: TIME TO PARTY!

Everybody take to the streets on Tuesday, February 17, for Mardi Gras! The parade starts at 3pm when the big floats—eight are expected this vear—leave from the commercial port. Their itinerary through the streets of Gustavia has seven stations: near the pharmacy. the Cour

Vendôme, Le Select, La Cantina, the Anglican Church, the post office, and l'Escale d'Avriette. With a pause at each of the stations, staying in each spot a little longer than last year. There will also be music by the Youngz, in association with United Band, with a Carnival "jump up" and a concert after the parade on the Ouai du Général de Gaulle, where there will be a bar

A new initiative this year by the Carnival organization committee, run by Dora Louis, is a temporary village—open during the parade—on the Retrocession Esplanade (between Gustav Burger and Bagatelle), with about a dozen stands offering goods for sale by artisans and merchants. There will also be a medical station manned by the firemen in the garden of the Anglican Church in case



of any accidents or heat stroke along the parade route.

There will also be a free shuttle service so that revelers do not have to drive into town where parking is limited, and the road is closed as of Public. The shuttle pickups are near the cemetery in Saint Jean and near Marché U, from 1pm to 9pm.

On Monday, February 16, La Pointe en Mouvement will honor the tradition of opening the Carnival celebration with a Pajama Parade in Gustavia starting at 6pm. Be sure to wear your jammies and a night cap!

Carnival concludes on Ash Wednesday, when an effigy of Vaval is burned on Shell Beach, following a final parade through the streets of Gustavia. The dress code for this is black and white.

#### ART AT LES ARTISANS

combination gallery and jewelry store. Les Artisans is located in the heart of Gustavia (rue du General de Gaulle) and has a year-round collection of art featuring painting and sculpture. A peek around the shop reveals the colorful paintings of French artist Alain Le Chatelier, who often paints as if from a bird's-eye view above his subject, with a wonderful sense of color and humor woven into his work. His paintings are always worth a second, if not a third look, as every time you are guaranteed to see something you missed before. In

pastels as he finds they capture the light nicely, giving his work the luminosity he likes as he interprets

the landscapes of the island (Langlais will open his annual winter show at Les Artisans on Friday, February 20). American sculptor Dave Stevenson is also represented here, with a series of abstract pieces in bronze as well as stainless steel. The sculptor likes the cool, austere character of steel for the futuristic look of his more mysterious pieces. He recently completed a monumental, eight-foot-high commissioned bronze version of his original 22" "Nautilus" for a private garden setting in the United States. Collections at Les Artisans also include custom jewelry by owners Jo-Anne Ouestel and Albert Yaphet, and

Cape Cod-based goldsmith Ross Coppleman, among others.


