Music In The Air

The Saint Barth Music Festival continues through January 22, but there are a few special events noted in this issue of *The Weekly*, from a special concert at *Le Sereno* by violinist Christopher Wu and cellist Owen Young on January 12 as the full moon rises over the island, then the popular opera evening on January 13, conducted by Steven Mercurio.

The festival got off to a great start with a two-part recital on Sunday, January 8. Starting with Canadian pianist Carson Becke, followed by a champagne toast in the garden provided by Dantes Magras of the *Cave du Port Franc*. It was a special evening for Dantes, as his son, Emil Beronious Magras led the second half of the concert, playing the flute as part of a Swedish quartet. A wonderful debut for Magras at the festival, and a lovely chance to hear a native son share his talent with his island.

It was a big week for St Barth's ties to Sweden, not only at the music festival, but also with the visit of Swedish ambassador to France, Veronika Wand-Danielsson, who made a special point of visiting with Marius at *Le Select*, as he was honored with the Swedish Order of the Polar Star, and is a big friend to Sweden.

I am looking forward to the rest of the music festival, especially an evening of silent films set to music at *AJOE* on Sunday, January 15. Which reminds me I better get a move on for the program of the St Barth Film Festival at the end of April. It's right around the corner!

Opera Night In St Barth

A highlight of the 33rd St Barth Music Festival is the Opera Evening on Friday, January 13 at 8pm at the Catholic Church in Lorient. Once again, the opera orchestra is under the lively direction of internationally acclaimed maestro Steven Mercurio, who is back for his ninth season at the Festival, having missed 2011 as he was on tour with Sting and The London Philharmonic.

This year's program features four talented singers performing a program of opera highlights: sopranos Adrienn Miksch and Mary Dunleavy, tenor James Valenti (who was a huge hit at the festival in 2014 and 2015), and bass-baritone Timothy Renner. "The highlights programs allow you to include a lot of greatest hits, and different musical styles, rather than an entire evening of one composer. This way, each of the singers can show off what they do best," says Mercurio, noting that some years that means more popular arias, some years it means more new things to discover."

The choice of music also depends on who is available in terms of singers. "I always start with my friends, people I have worked with before, and people who work well together," adds the maestro. "Each of these four singers has an aria or two, plus cer-

tain duets and trios to show off their voices."

Mercurio has also included one of his own compositions on the program for the first time: "Let Sleeping Dogs Lie," the second movement of his four-movement symphony, "A Grateful Tail, which premiered in Prague a few years ago. Mercurio has created a three-part animal-related section to the program, including Rossini's "Cat Duet" with two female cats, the famous Papageno-Papagena duet from Mozart's "The Magic Flute" for two birds, and Mercurio's dogs for the orchestra.

What brings this busy conductor back to the island year after year? "The players," he says, without hesitation. "And Frances De Broff for doing this. It's a great place, and these are all super-star players who leave their assignments and their orchestras to be here. They love playing together. They get to play chamber music, orchestral music, and opera highlights. I look forward to seeing all these musicians every January, the camaraderie is terrific."

MUSIC AND FULL MOON AT LE SERENO

Music is in the air on Thursday, January 12 when the full moon rises over Le Sereno Hotel, as it presents a special concert at 6:30pm by violinist Christopher Wu and cellist Owen Young, in conjunction with the 33rd annual St Barth Music Festival. The concert is free, with complimentary canapés, and the bar will be open for the purchase of drinks.

The concert program comprises the Handel-Halvorsen “Pascaglia,” and Beethoven’s “Duo for Violin and Cello in C major.”

Guests can stay for a special Full Moon Dinner with three courses for 75€ per person or four courses

for 80€ per person. The menu includes goat cheese and beetroot bruschetta, foie gras terrine with red onion marmalade, or mackerel escabeche with orange pure and crunchy fennel; ricotta and spinach ravioli, tagliatelle with rabbit ragout, or seafood and bottarga tagliolini; breaded skate wing with butter noisette, sauce tartar and picked fennel; pluma Iberica with polenta and apple chutney, or eggplant Parmigiana style; and Peanut mousse or Tiramisu for dessert. There is also a telescope to watch the moon rise over the beach.



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
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Sensors On The Road To Capture Traffic Movement

For the past week or so, sensors placed on the island's roads are intended to measure how much traffic goes by. These are narrow, parallel cables placed across the road, so that cars can ride over them. Optic sensors are being used in additional locations, so that Suez Consulting can analyze the traffic in a total of 16 spots around the island, as commissioned by the Economic, Social, Cultural, and Environmental Council (CESCE) of Saint Barthélemy to do a study on traffic mobility. The goal of this study is to improve fluidity and avoid bottlenecks on the roads. And especially to "put the needs of the tourists first," indicates Pierre-Marie Majorel, president of the CESCE, "so that our dear visitors don't get stuck in traffic jams."

Before suggesting solutions, they will first "evaluate the traffic flow," notes Vincent Lichère, director of this study at Suez Consulting. "These emplacements on the island are not necessarily the spots where there is the most traffic," Lichère explains. "They are based on a division of the island into roughly 10 zones. The sensors were placed where the zones

meet. The idea is to measure the flow from zone to zone," he adds. "The two cables on the ground are capable of measuring the distance between the axles. As well as distinguishing between cars, scooters, and trucks."

Installed shortly before the holidays, these sensors will remain in place until January 18, as the level of traffic on the island includes taking kids to school. After that date, Suez has planned to conduct interviews with various individuals on the island: "to better understand the reasons they drive where they do," says Lichère. This information will be cross-referenced with data based on the population, employment, and various activities. The goal is to get a prospective, make simulations, and be able to tell, in function of the evolution of the population, the number of jobs, urbanism, number of hotel rooms, "how traffic might evolve," Lichère predicts, with "the risk of blockage at one point or another." Once they have made their evaluation, they will be able to come to conclusions and try and find good solutions to a growing problem.



Swedish Ambassador In Saint Barth

Veronika Wand-Danielsson, who has been the Swedish Ambassador to France since September 1, 2014, made her first visit to Saint Barth last week, as part of a tour to the consulates in the French overseas territories of the Caribbean. Accompanied by Saint Barth's honorary consul, Dantès Magras, the ambassador met with Bruno Magras, the president of the Collectivité, on Wednesday, January 4, on which date she also met with the regional prefect, Anne Laubies, who came over from Saint Martin.




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The Governors' House

Built in approximately 1796-1799, this house was first the private home of Daniel Öström. It was not until 1816 that it officially became the Swedish customs house. In 1861, it was transformed as the home for governor Carl Ulrich. When St Barthélemy was returned to France in 1878, this house became the property of the French government. Until 2001, it served as the island's Town Hall, but was replaced by a new building near the Wall House on the far side of the port.

The Governors' House was actually only the home to the last two Swedish governors in Saint Barth, Fredrik Carl Ulrich and Bror Ludvig Ulrich, before the retrocession of the island to France in 1878. By comparing two maps made by Samuel Fahlberg, it can be estimated that The Governors' House was built between 1796 and 1799. Thanks to research by Arlette Magras and the website www.memoirestbarth.com, we also know that this was originally a private house belonging to the Swede, Daniel Öström, before being purchased by the Swedish Crown in 1816 as its customs office. When sold in 1816, the property comprised: a building with a lower

level in stone and fragments of lava; an upper story made of wood; a vaulted stone kitchen behind the main building; and a cistern at the back of the garden. The façade of the house was originally painted white. The suspended gallery was adorned with green slatted shutters and white exterior shutters. The roof was covered with wooden shingles.

Badly damaged by the hurricane of 1837, the building was extensively renovated before becoming The Governors' House in 1861, and the town hall of Saint Barthélemy in 1878. While the upstairs continued to serve as offices for the mayor and his staff, the ground floor served over the years as a cell for those who disturbed the peace, the

tourist office, the first municipal library, the municipal police station, as well as other local services. After 123 years of loyal service, the building was abandoned in 2001 when the new town hall was built on the other side of the harbor, on The Point, and which became the "Hôtel de la Collectivité" in 2008. Eaten by termites and battered by bad weather, the upper wood-

en story of The Governors' House was torn down in 2010. All that remains today is the lower level of volcanic stone, the kitchen, and cistern. The Collectivity, which owns the property, has expressed its desire to rebuild it in the same style, but no decision has been made as to the future use of this building, which is still on the list of Historic Monuments.
