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What Inspires You?

For many artists, the island of St Barth provides an incredible source of inspiration. Take the work of photographer Pierre Carreau and painter Jérôme Rapin currently on display at the Pop-Up Gallery in Gustavia. They have both been inspired by the beautiful landscapes of this slice of paradise.

NEWS BRIEFS

HOW MANY PEOPLE LIVE IN SAINT BARTH?

According to the French Institute of Statistics, the island of St Barth had 9,427 residents in 2014. This number was extrapolated from the results of a census done five years ago. A new census is underway through February 28, which will give a truer number of the island's population. And allow for the correction in the extrapolations made year after year by looking at the actual evolution observed between the last census and this one.

SAINT BARTH SUPPORTS MARINE MAMMALS

On Wednesday, January 11, Saint Barthélemy took part in the annual management committee meeting for AGOA—protected areas for marine mammals. Benoit Chauvin on behalf of the Collectivité, Serge Toulet for the Territorial Environmental Agency, and Ophélie Magras for the Tourism Committee (CTTSB) represented St Barth. The meeting “validated the plan of action for 2017,” for AGOA, indicates Chauvin. Additional orders of business comprised the “review of whale watching companies, an update of ongoing scientific studies, and the exchange of ideas with our counterparts from other islands,” adds Chauvin, a member of the island's executive council. In addition, Serge Toulet, head of the marine sector of St Barth's Territorial Environmental Agency, was elected to the board of AGOA, to represent the protected marine mammal sanctuaries. During the January 11 meeting, it was decided that the next management committee meeting for AGOA would be held Saint Barth. “We look forward to welcoming them at the end of the year,” notes Chauvin.

KAP NATIREL LOOKING FOR PHOTOS AND VIDEOS OF RAYS

In charge of the ReGuar network (all about sharks in the French West Indies) the association Kap Natirel is seeking photos and videos of rays, which are of the same family: images of stingrays, manta rays, or torpedo rays, taken in waters around the island. The goal of the association is to identify and count the species that are present, as certain are in critical danger of extinction. Email: contact@reguar.org.

NEW PARK AND PARKING BEHIND THE HOSPITAL



This park was primarily intended for the “residents at the EHPAD, or those in the hospital who can go outside,” notes Sophie Oli-vaud, director of the island’s technical services office. It was conceived as a “place to walk, as well as for intergenerational gatherings, when families come to visit,” adds Oli-vaud. There is also a playground for children.

Those who are desperately seeking parking in Gustavia will be happy to know there are now an additional 60 places available behind the Hospital de Bruyn, although this

does require a bit of walking to the center of town. Open since the end of December, there is also a new park there that has an incredible view of the sea, and of neighboring islands in the distance.

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LOCAL ELECTIONS: WHO IS RUNNING?

The first round of local elections takes places on March 19. So far, two people have announced that they will present lists for these territorial elections: H el ene Bernier and Benoit Chauvin. What about Bruno Magras?



Benoit Chauvin and his colleague Bettina Cointre are already on the territorial council as opposition members from Tous Pour Saint-Barth, which will once again throw its collective

hat into the ring. "Our list is being finalized," says Chauvin, without revealing the other names in addition to Cointre. "A good number were already on our list in 2012," adds Chauvin, who is trying for the

third time to win the local election, after running in 2007, then again in 2012. "We would like to be elected in order to guarantee the residents of Saint Barth the best possible quality of life," he indicates.

And Bruno Magras? Imagine that the current president of the Collectivit e does not run again this year, leaving his place to someone else, which was reportedly his intention five years ago. Yet he ran and won in 2012, with his list, Saint-Barth d'Abord, holding 16 of the 19 seats on the Territorial Council. In public, Bruno Magras is vague about his intentions for 2017. "In deciding if I will run, I have to wait a while to estimate the force of my adversaries," he responds. Yet during executive council meetings, Magras apparently has spoken about his plans as head of the Collectivit e for the next five years. "Ideas are being formulated for the years to come," he declared publicly at the fete of Saint Barth el emy, last August.

After much reflection, H el ene Bernier, president of the environmental protection association, Saint-Barth Essentiel, has decided to run as well. "I will present a list for the next presidential elections," she has announced. "Today, we are all in agreement: we cannot continue to develop the island in the same anarchistic manner, and that has been the case for many years already," she states. "My experience with the association has made me realize that to really change things, political action is the only leverage." Bernier has enlisted Maxime Desouches, who in 2007 and 2012 headed his own list.

Once again, it will be up to the voters to decide who runs the island for the next five years.

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HOW MANY EMPTY VILLAS AT CHRISTMAS?




Over the Christmas-New Year's holidays, there were fewer people reportedly on the island. How many fewer exactly? Even if the hotels were all full between Christmas and New Year's, the same was not the case for the seasonal vacation villas. To try and answer this question, members of the island's real estate agencies association met on Tuesday, January 17, yet they did not want to reveal any exact numbers after the meeting. On the other hand, two opposition members (Tous Pour Saint-Barth) on the territorial council tried to come up with a response. By looking at the reservations made for the weeks of Christmas and New Year's on the websites for the four principal rental agencies (Wimco, Sibarth, St-Barth Proper-

ties, Ici et Là). According to the blog for Tous Pour Saint-Barth (www.tous-poursaintbarth.fr), only 75.2% of the rental villas were occupied for the Christmas holiday. That means one villa out of every four was not occupied, while for New Year's Eve, 81.3% of the villas were rented for the peak of the season, or one out of five left empty. "This raw data is interesting to analyze in terms of tourism. "Why weren't we full?" ask the two council members. In spite of these numbers, their main concern is urban planning. "The data shows that there are too many viilas on the rental market," if they prove to be "largely under used, especially at the height of the season," extrapolate the two members of Tous Pour Saint-Barth. "And yet, more projects, authorized over the past few years, will be built and add to the

rental inventory," point out Bettina Cointre and Benoit Chauvin. "The numbers prove that the construction of larger,

more imposing villas, are not needed to support the tourism economy. Wore, to overbuild, to have too much density, to continue to destroy that which made Saint Barthélemy attractive," they insist. At the risk of seeing the island "get caught in a vicious circle."

Artist Bios

Pierre Carreau is a professional photographer who is passionate about the beautiful landscapes

of St Barth. He has captured every beach and corner, and revealed the beautiful blue and azure of the sea. Born in 1972 near Paris, Carreau grew up surrounded by artistic influences in a family that included a photographer, sculptors, and painters.

In 2004, he moved with his wife and children to the Caribbean island of St Barthélemy. This small paradise has become his open-air studio, where the subtle variations of light from the tropical sun and the endlessly changing soul of the sea become the subject of his vision.

Jérôme Rapin, is a fine artist, painter and illustrator, who studied in Cardiff, Wales. Since 2000, his work, original-

ly centered on the body and its weaknesses, has been featured in various group and solo exhibitions in Bristol, Cardiff, and London, and also in various France cities.

Today, his new work is at the edge between the figurative and abstract worlds. His paintings give him a huge sense of freedom and are considered a visual memory of the places that marked his life, starting with St Barth. These views 'taken from the sky' are fond memories and a tribute to his past as a private pilot, and these landscapes allow him to be 'above' life and the complexity on earth.


