#### Artists of Saint-Barth, New Gallery, New Event

The association, Artists of Saint-Barth, which represents 50 local artists, has moved its Pati's Gallery to the new Pati de St Barth store, around the corner from the Villa Créole (when heading toward Lorient). They not only have a new space, but are organizing a new event with the Territorial Tourism Committee: Art Week, January 7-12, officially launched in Paris by photographer Antoine Verglas.

## New Year's Eve Regatta Sets Sails On December 31

A parade of boats, big and small, sails around the island of Saint Barth on the last day of the year. The 24th edition of this event takes place on Monday, December 31, a "nautical parade" organized by the Saint Barth Yacht Club, the Port of Gustavia, Annalisa Gee, and Mark Del-Giudice, who launched the race in 1995 and now lives in Newport, RI, but comes back almost every year to help.

The list of entries is not yet set for this year, but DelGiudice hopes that Lloyd Thornburg will have his Gunboat, Phaedo, here in time, and perhaps the 198' Perini Navi yacht, Perseus, will make an appearance as well. Frits Bus usually sails over



from St Martin with his Melges 24 Island Water World, and local boats such as Raphael Magras' 34' Maelia, Raymond Magras 34' Speedy Nemo, and Puffy, a 53' Swan, are regular participants.

No matter which boats are on the starting line, this nautical parade

will be a great way to say au revoir to 2018 and sail into 2019, as a prelude to the holiday festivities in Saint Barth. But can anyone beat the record of 1 hour, 32 minutes, and 7 seconds set back on December 31, 2004 by the 147' Baltic yacht, Visione?



### Monthly Market In Gustavia

The first monthly Saint Barth Market was held last April, starting a new island tradition. Organized by the Collectivité, this event is held the first Sunday of every month on Rue Général-de-Gaulle (the cobblestone road from Le Select toward Les Artisans). The market was an immediate success with

the local population as well as with tourists. Shop owners and artisans present their wares, and the long line of cars creating a traffic jam attests to the popularity



of the market (better to park on the edge of town and walk).

What can one find here? Generally speaking, the most popular stands

are those of the bakeries, which sell bread, brioche, and pastry. And the traditional West Indian cuisine from Cré'age and vegan treats from Alice Romney always attract a crowd, as does the ice cream seller. Other than food, one can find clothing, local jewelers, imported fruit and vegetables, artisanal products such as soap, hand-turned wood, work by local artists, coffee, and rum...

Approximately 20 stands are open from 8am to 12pm. The next Market is on Sunday, January 6.

### A Website For Saint Barth Taxis

The Collectivity has launched a new website for the geo-location of taxis in Saint Barthélemy. On a digital map, one can see which taxis are available, or not, in real time, and where they are located on the island. Just click on the closest icon and the driver's name, telephone number, and type of vehicle appears... This service, suggested by the island's hotels, should facilitate reserving a taxi and simplify contact between clients and taxis. There is a full list of the island's 43 taxis with contact info, but not all of them appear on the digital map yet. The site also features a chart with taxi rates: taxis.eservices-comstbarth.fr.

#### LVMH Buys Belmond Hotels, Including Properties in Saint Martin And Anguilla


Luxury goods group LVMH, owner of the Cheval Blanc-Isle de France in Flamands, has made additional inroads into the hotel industry by purchasing Belmond Hotels, as announced by LVHM on December 14. An acquisition valued at 2.82 billion euros. Belmond is a big player on the luxury hotel scene around the world, with 46 hotels as well as luxury trains and boats for river cruises. In 2017, the company made 572M€ in sales. In the Caribbean, Belmond is owner of two prestigious hotels: La

Samanna in Saint Martin and Cap Juluca in Anguilla (photo). Bernard Arnault, chairman of LVMH, noted that the acquisition will be finalized in early 2019.



#### Archeological Study Near Gustavia Lighthouse

A project to extend the dispensary, which is scheduled to include the construction of a typical Swedish cottage and a botanical garden, as well as improve the area around the fromager, the large tree overlooking port, is underway. Last week, archeologists engaged in preventive digs at the request of the DAC in Guadeloupe (Cultural Affairs Department), as the site might well contain vestiges of the past that prove of interest. After several days of investigation, these experts will start working on a diagnostic report for the regional prefect, who will be the deciding factor in the next steps based on this report, which should be submitted before March 2019.

Yachts are lining up at the dock and in the harbor, the ballet of small planes intensifies, hotels are almost full, and there won't be a single rental car available. High season is back!

ll systems are a go: the holidays will indeed be festive once again in Saint Barth. Perhaps not at the same level as before Irma, but the island is very busy. "Other than the Guanahani and Eden Rock, which will not open this season, the hotels are full and the villas are back at 100%," assures Marie-Laure Belzic, director of the Saint Barth Tourist Office. "It's very positive!" And news from the tourist sector is encouraging...

#### Airport Almost As Busy As 2016

Figures from the airport should be taken with a grain of salt as

they are compared to those of 2017, a year with little tourism after September when Irma hit. Compared to the same period pre-hurricane, air traffic is not quite as high: "The level of activity from January to August 2018 represents 71% of the activity in 2017 for the same period," notes Fabrice Danet, director of the airport. "The months of September, October, and November 2018 reached 97% of the same months in 2016," he adds. Which indicates that high season 2018 should see a return to the normal level of tourism. Data for December has yet to be confirmed, but early reports point to a nice boost in traffic for the

beginning of the high season."

#### The Yachts Are Cruising In

A few dozen yachts were already in the harbor earlier this week. "The season should be better than in 2017, based on the requests we have had, but will still be under we 2015/2016," indicates Ernest Brin, director of the port, who adds that the commercial port will also host mega yachts from December 29 to January 1. Brin notes that through December 15 this year, the number of yachts and sailboats in the port comprised 3,024 entries for 18,394 people. In 2017, the annual total was 5,402 entries for 36,711 people. To go a little

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deeper, two trends are worth noting: the length of stay for the large boats is decreasing little by little; and since 2016, the largest boats (over 100 meters, and from 75 to 100 meters) are less numerous. On the other hand, swells in the Port of Gustavia caused a yacht to leave for repairs. Fingers crosses that the swells remain calm!

#### **Not Enough Rental Cars**

"We except a very good season, and are already sold-out as of December 25 or 26," indicates Arnaud Grandclerc, president of the Saint Barthélemy car rental agencies association. "Reservations look excellent, there won't be enough cars to meet the demand." The rental agencies anticipated this and ordered new cars, but the registration service was in the process of moving from Gustavia to Lorient, and is closed until the end of December, making it impossible to get the new cars on the road. "Reservations are at a level we haven't seen in a long time," adds Grandclerc, whose agency Toploc also rents a catamaran with skipper. "You have to go back six or seven years to find this many reservation... all systems are go!"

#### 95% Of Villas Operational

In the case of villa rentals, "things look good," for Pascale Minarro-Baudouin, president of the Saint Barthélemy real estate agencies association. "95% of the villas are operational, as we had hoped. There are still a few villas available for the 31st but they are filling up little by little. But same situation as with the yachts, clients are looking for shorter stays. "The owners are being flexible and accepting fewer nights,"says Minarro-Baudouin. "It has gone from 14 nights to 12 or 10 nights. But things look very positive for the season."

#### Hotels Full For Christmas And New Year

"Everything looks great," says Anne Dentel, president of the Saint Barthélemy hotels and villas association. "Availability is very limited as of December 26-28, when the demand is highest," she adds, nothing that four hotels are still closed this season: Eden Rock, Guanahani, Carl Gustaf, and the ex-Taïwana, now part of Cheval Blanc Isle de France, which reopened with 40 rooms as of early December.

## The First "Questionnaire Ashtrays" Await Smokers

uring many island cleanups, the association Saint-Barth Essentiel was always amazed by the number of cigarette butts found on the ground, along the roads, on the beach, and even in the sea. "To fight this, we gave out beach ashtrays and pocket ashtrays," notes Hélène Bernier, president of the association.

Other groups did the same (Coral Restoration, Lions Club), yet many smokers continue to drop their cigarette butts everywhere. "We discovered Tree6clope, an environmental association in the South of France that has started a campaign to collect and recycle cigarette butts. The first goal of course it to get people to put them in an ashtray," Bernier points out.

But there is a twist to the new wallmounted ashtrays the association is promoting: when throwing away a



cigarette, the smoker answers a question. These "questionnaire ashtrays" are now installed at Nikki Beach and at Raymond Lédée's garage. "And soon at Ti Saint-Barth, Marché U, and we hope at the ferry terminal in Gustavia, where cigarette butts go directly into the harbor," says Bernier.

Hopefully smokers in Saint Barth will use these ashtrays, answer the questions and help preserve the environment...










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## Hear It From The Kids!

A Euro-Caribbean class of eighth graders in Saint Barth was asked to write about their island — in English! We think they did a great job (only a few small edits were needed...) and we are pleased to share their comments, this week about leisure activities, wildlife and restaurants. So even if you are a frequent visitor, or perhaps a resident, and know the island rather well, it's actually quite charming to see Saint Barth through the eyes of these kids who are lucky enough to live here!

#### Leisure activities

On our island, there are lots of sports activities, whether they are nautical or terrestrial. Nautical activities are more accessible than anywhere else thanks to our calm, warm, and turquoise water. To start. Grand-Cul-De-Sac lagoon is the most magical place to practice windsurfing and kitesurfing. From your board you can sometimes see turtles and a lot of different fish in the water. It is also possible to rent boats to explore all the small islands around St Barth: Pinel, Fourchue, Tintamarre. But our very special treasure is a natural pool in Petit-Cul-De-Sac. To find it, you need to climb a beautiful mountain. Its crystal blue water is just amazing. But never go there when there are big waves, it can be very dangerous. If you like to go for a walk, you will have a lot of fun along our incredible beaches, like in Flamands. We also have an amazing sports area in Saint Jean with a beautiful stadium. This is where you will meet our rugby club and our soccer team created by volunteers. There is also a tennis club, two steps away, where you can rent equipment and practice with professionals. If you want to try a new activity, you should go to our beach tennis club. You will have a lot of fun and new sensations. The goal of everyone on the island is to satisfy the dreams and desires of their guests, so that each trip to St Barth is a moment of peacefulness, far from anxiety and stress.



#### Restaurants

In Saint Barth, there are different types of restaurants to enjoy while you are here. Typical French cuisine is often really appreciated by tourists. The majority of these restaurants are located in the capital city of Gustavia. The others are located all around the island, especially in beach hotels and in different districts like Saline, Flamands, Saint Jean, Lorient, etc... Apart from those restaurants, you can find more typical ones. Those restaurants are really appreciated by tourists too because they offer authentic Caribbean food. You should also try the first restaurant opened on the island: Le Select. It was opened in 1949! It serves cheeseburgers, fish burgers, chicken, and much

more. If you feel like cooking at home, you can find certain ingredients such as lobster and excellent fish, fruits and vegetables on the island. The fishermen of Saint Barth go fishing every morning from 4am to 6am and then sell the fish to restaurants or residents. Be careful! If you want some fish, you have to go there really early in the morning! Bon appétit!

## Wildlife

Welcome to Saint Barth! We are going to present to you the endemic species that are found in Saint Barth. First, you can easily find some medicinal plants. The leaves are used to treat burns and as a purgative, they are extremely thick and succulent. Their presence in gardens is said to keep parasites off. There are also some fruits like the malayan apple, as well as a local type of lemon and finally the physalis that we mostly use for pastry cooking and the quenette that we can savor as a syrup with rum. Furthermore, we can find the sapodilla, whose fruits and seeds are valued for their medicinal properties. You can also find the clammon-cherry, whose fruit was used as paper glue to paste stamps or seal envelopes, and the tamarind, whose fruit was used for jam, juice, or punch. There are also some protected species like the guayacan, which has a hard green wood very warm. Finally, you can find the last existing mangrove in Saint-Barts, in Grand-Cul-De-Sac, where we find four kinds of mangrove tree or a very particular crab called "the sand fiddler crab,"



whose one pincer is very big. Finally, you can find the red-footed tortoise and the lesser Antillean iguana as you take a walk along the road. As you can see, our island possesses a vast amount of wildlife and flora that the visitors can enjoy if they stop along the way.



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## 2019 St Barth Music Festival

f you schedule a winter visit around the St Barth Music Festival in order to enjoy their wonderful concerts, this year will not disappoint. One might call it a year of favorites, with such repeat performances as ballet on the dock, a Brazilian evening (introduced last year to great acclaim), the ever-popular opera night, and the return of Makana, the Hawaiian guitarist who took the festival by storm back in 2010.

In 2019, this renowned festival of classical music, opera, and jazz,

with a splash of dance, celebrates its 35th anniversary, opening



with two dance evenings on the main dock in Gustavia, to the delight of the anchored yachts. Music concerts take place in the island's churches as well as at AJOE in Lorient.

The dance performances on the dock January 4 and 5 include such classical ballet numbers as the Wedding Pas de Deux from Sleeping Beauty, a variation from Giselle, and Le Corsaire, as well as the Balanchine/Gershwin Who Cares? "Fascinatin' Rhythm" Variation.

Greg Bosc who will also lead a sound healing using Tibetan bowls. The class will end with a live Mandala and closing meditation.


