st barth music festival A Musical Journey From Brazil To Hawaii



he 35th anniversary of the St Barth Music Festival takes on an international flavor. from an accent on Brazil on Saturday, January 12 to Hawaii on Saturday and Sunday, January 19 and 20. These concerts are bookends to the festival's more classical fare, with chamber music, an orchestral concert, and opera, as well as a children's concert. All performed by a cadre of internationally acclaimed musicians!

The Brazilian inspiration comes from that oh-so-talented oboist Alex Klein, who was born in Brazil, and introduced the Brazilian night at the festival last year to much applause. This year Klein will be joined by Josephina Vergara on violon, Felipe Fraga on percussion, João Pedro Mourão on guitar, Alex Sopp on flute, Julia Pessoa, soprano, and Richard Troxell, tenor. And who doesn't like a little bossa nova?

Jazz is on the menu on Sunday, January 13 at 5pm at the Anglican Church in Gustavia, with the return of Victor Provost who adds a Caribbean accent to a jazz quartet with the steel pan. Definitely a unique sound, so tune in as Provost is joined by Billy Williams, percussion, Lorin Cohen, bass, and Robert Rodriguez, piano. The ever-popular opera night, 8pm on Friday, January 18 at the Catholic Church in Lorient features the Puccini favorite, La Boheme, with sopranos Ginger Costa-Jackson and Marina Costa-Jackson; bassbaritones, Jamie Offenbach and Peter Strummer; baritone Ed Parks; and tenors Richard Trowel and Gino Quilico. Maestro Steven Mercurio returns to conduct with panache.

Makana, the fabulous Hawaiian "slack" guitarist who took the festival by storm in 2008 and 2010 is also back this year, and is joined by two additional Hawaiian artists: Lopaka, an acclaimed percussionist, and Kawena, a traditional hula dancer. They will perform at 7pm on Saturday, January 19 at AJOE in Lorient, and 5pm on Sunday, January 20 at the Anglican Church.

For those in a more classical mood, check the online program for details about the chamber music and orchestral concerts, always very high quality, as the festival once again displays its musical prowess.

News Briefs

Phaedo Flies Again!

Lloyd Thornburg loves speed, and once again sailed to victory in 2 hours and 6 minutes with Phaedo, his bright orange Gunboat 66 catamaran in New Year's Eve Regatta, an annual around-the-island parade of sailboats held on the last day of the year. The 24th edition of this event took place on Monday, December 31, 2018, organized by the Saint Barth Yacht Club, the Port of Gustavia, Annelisa Gee, and Mark Del Giudice, who launched the race in 1995 and now lives in Newport, RI, but comes back almost every year to help.

"The weather turned out to be beautiful on the 31st with wind of 12 to 18 knots," notes Del Giudice, who was sailing on Phaedo. "There were several larger sailboats that would have liked to participate but due to the high number of yachts in the anchorage this year, they were worried that they would have lost their spot."

Benoit Meesmaecker, president of the Saint Barth Yacht Club, sailed with Frits Bus on his Melges 24, which comes over from St Martin for the race every year. "They started half an hour before we did on Phaedo and we passed them just after bay of St Jean. Benoit and I discussed improving the rating systems, and having a separate class for multi hulls moving forward," says Del Giudice, who adds that "Annelisa does her best helping with times based on past years but Caribbean rating systems may be best."

With a small fleet of just 10 boats in the race, the organizers hope there will be a better turn out next year, with as many as 30 or more boats sailing into the New Year.

Project Pélican To The Rescue

Project Pelican has been launched. Its first task is the renovation of a small, traditional cottage in Lorient, rendered unlivable by hurricane Irma on September 6, 2017. As the owner did not have insurance, various associations are helping with the reconstruction of this home. The Collectivity provided $8,000 \in$, as they did for another 141 residents who also lacked insurance. The Red Cross will assume 30% of the costs, while Help Saint-Barth, an association created by three Americans right after the hurricane, will cover the rest. An older woman, without enough resources to renovate, lived alone in this house. To improve her quality of life, a ramp will be installed, allowing her access her house in the wheelchair donated by the



Red Cross. Five similar cases will also be helped by the same project. But Help Saint-Barth, the primary donor, still needs to raise funds. "We estimate the cost to be 250,000€ to complete the five final projects, based on the support provided by our partners," explains the association. They are calling upon the generosity of donors to complete the work required for Project Pelican.

2018: The Year In Review



Third Victory For Phaedo

Phaedo, Lloyd Thornburg's orange Gunboat 66, won the 23rd edition of the annual New Year's nautical parade on December 31, 2017. This was the third victory for Thornburg, clocking a time of 3h 1mn 55sec sailing around the island.

Dancing Into The New Year

The 2018 Music Festival opened with performances by a group of talented dancers from the Paris Opera Ballet, with two well-attended evenings under the stars on the main in Gustavia.

835 Million Euros

In mid-January, the French Insurance Federation estimated the damage caused by hurricane Irma in St Barth: $835M \in$ and almost two billion for Saint Martin. This catastrophe is one of the most expensive in the history of France, especially considering the number of residents. In Saint Barth, the average reimbursement was $100,000 \in$.

February

Mardi Gras!



The first big celebration since Irma, Carnival 2018 was a little smaller than in past years, but saw a lot of dancing in the streets with eight floats and the burning of Vaval the next night. Traditions live on!

French Sailors In Gustavia

Sailors from the new French naval ship, La Confiance, visited St Barth, as this is now the patron ship for Saint Barthélemy, replacing La Capricieuse, which has been retired. A high-tech marvel based in Guyana, La Confiance anchored by the Hôtel de la Collectivité for two days, during which time 820 residents went aboard. A successful introduction!

Maych

Nilaya Wins The Bucket Regatta!

The prestigious Saint Barth Bucket regatta raised its sails with 26 fabulous boats on the starting line. Nilaya, Filiep Balcaen's 34-meter sloop, took top honors. This was the yacht's third entry in the race.

Electric Bills: A New Agreement

In 2008, as part of its new status, the Collectivity added energy to its jurisdiction. But there has been a lingering doubt: would Saint Barth still benefit from subsidized rates, which allow the residents to pay four to six times less for electricity than it costs to produce. In early March, the territorial council approved the signing of a new three-way agreement (Collectivity, EDF, French government) that guarantees the same subsidies for the island.

Cut Off From The World

During the night of March 4-5, an underwater communications cable was cut and Saint Barthélemy found itself isolated from the outside world: no networks, no Wi-Fi. The Wi-Fi hot spots used right after Irma were put in place again, but this crisis impacted the island for a few days.

April

Run Eco Team With 200 People

Run or walk, and pick up trash at the same time: the first Run Eco Team organized by Dalkia Wastenergy (ex-Tiru) on April 15 attracted over 200 people for a 6km itinerary. They collected over 600 pounds of trash. Good job!

And All That Jazz!

For the first time, the Saint Barth Book Festival added a Jazz Festival to its menu. Eight musicians, invited by the association Saint-B'Art, played at various spots, much to the delight of the island's jazz fans.

Sargasso Sea

April saw the first massive invasion of sargassum seaweed in the water and on the beach. The Collectivity worked hard to clean it up on a daily basis: effective but costly. Anse des Cayes and Marigot were the hardest hit. This invasion of seaweed continued into May, with the Collectivity working hard to clear the beaches for residents and tourists.

The First Sunday Market



A new event that was immediately popular: the first Saint Barth Market, organized by the Collectivity on April 15 attracted several hundred people and caused a traffic jam getting into Gustavia, where parking spots were as scarce as hen's teeth. From 18 stands the first month to more than 40 in December for a pre-Christmas edition of the market.

In Case Of A Tsunami...

After a conference by tsunami experts from project Exploit, the theory was put into practice: island students and agents of the Collectivity took part in an exercise to test the new alert sirens, and the efficiency of the signage system for shelters in case of massive waves.

Proteus Wins Les Voiles!

Fifty-three boats set sail in the five days of races during the 9th edition of Les Voiles de Saint-Barth. Winner in 2016 and 2017, Proteus, a maxi 72, owned by American George Sakellaris, won for the third time!



Franketienne: Special Guest At Film Fest

Haitian poet and artist Franketienne was the guest of honor at the 23rd annual St Barth Film Festival, where he was the subject of a documentary about his life and work by Arnold Antonin. The festival ran through May 5, closing with the Oscar-winning film, The Shape of Water.

10.5 Tons Of Trash

On Sunday, May 20, 150 volunteers participated in Saint Barth Clean Up, organized by the Lions Club and Rotary Club. They collected 10.5 tons of trash from along the roads on the island, while Serial Divers helped with the underwater cleanup.

Hardy/Ruyant win La Transat

On May 10 at sunset, the duo of Adrien Hardy and Thomas Ruyant aboard Agir Recouvrement crossed

the finish line in the Port of Gustavia, winning the 14th edition of the Transat AG2R-La Mondiale. They pulverized the record by 30 hours, finishing the transatlantic crossing in 18 days, 11 hours, 48 minutes and 22 seconds at an average speed of 8.76 knots. Local sailor Miguel Danet and teammate Eric Péron finished 8th aboard Le Macaron French Pastries in 19 days, 0 hours, 12 minutes, and 25 seconds.

June

Fort Gustav III And Extension of Dispensary

Plans are afoot to reconfigure the area around the lighthouse that overlooks Gustavia. The project, which includes an extension of the dispensary, the construction of a Swedish cottage, renovation of the fort, and creation of a botanical garden, was presented to the territorial council on June 1. They voted to ask for public opinion on the project, which requires a of the urbanism map.

International Surfing Competition In Saint Barth?

Jean-Luc Arassus, president of the French Surfing Federation, visited Saint Barth on June 4. A meeting at town hall included president Bruno Magras, president



of the sports commission Corine Fébrissy, Magali Maxor of the sports service, and David Blanchard, instructor at the AJOE Reefer Surf Club. The idea of a national surfing competition in Saint Barthélemy was discussed.



Outlawing The Biggest Trucks

As of January 1, 2019, tucks over 14 tons when charged, 2.42 meters wide, and 7 meters long, are prohibited to drive on the island, except in the industrial zone in Public. The territorial council adopted this rule on July 5, which concerns 20 vehicles in Saint-Barth. New speed limits (no higher than 40 km/h on the entire island for 3.5 tons and over, and 40km/h for everyone when it is raining) were also adopted at the same time.

Territorial Council Defends Bruno Magras Against Facebook Insult

A last minute deliberation at their July 5 meeting: the territorial council voted that Bruno Magras can press charges in his role of President of the Collectivity against a Facebook user who insulted him and called for him to be "burned at the stake." The judicial process is underway.

Instant Success For First Photo Festival

A new festival joins those for music, cinema, books, jazz, and theatre: the exhibits and ateliers for the first Saint Barth Photography Festival were popular with the public, opening the door to a second edition in 2019.

The Sit Of Saint Jean Stays In Saint Jean

And are still there... The Collectivity had suggested burying the silt removed from the pond under renovation in Saint Jean in an area behind the dune in Saline, as landfill. The site needed to be filled for security in any case but after hesitating, the owners of the land refused, forcing the Collectivity to return to its original plan of evacuation of the silt by barge.

World Cup Mania!

We are the champions! The French soccer team, "Les Bleus," won the World Cup in Russia, beating Croatia in the final. Large screen on the dock for a fan zone, dancing in the streets, and horns honking across the island as Saint Barth joined in the celebration!

Drug Bust In Gustavia

On July 23, the gendarmes arrested seven people sus-

pected of selling marijuana and cocaine to locals and tourists in the rue du Général de Gaulle in Gustavia. Two of these men were immediately imprisoned.



Bromates In Island Water

The Saur, the island's water company, raised an alarm on August 9 and by the Collectivity on August 20: no one should drink the water produced at the desalination plant due to the presence of bromates, a chemical substance potentially dangerous for one's health. The Saur, the SIDEM, the ARS, and the Collectivity launched investigations to find the cause of contamination and try to solve the problem. To date, the restrictions are still in place.

Saint Barthélemy, Saint Louis, and A Beach Party



Neighborhood festivities enlivened the month of August, with an evening of concerts on the beach in Public, a Caribbean Beach party, the Fete of Saint Barthélemy with official speeches and a fishing tournament, and the most traditional, the Fete of Saint Louis in Corossol.

September

First Anniversary Of Irma

One year after Irma, September 6, the island was back on its feet. Yet there were still after effects: insurance had not all been paid, certain families still didn't have a roof over their heads, and hotels were far from being completely renovated, In spite of these difficulties, "the result is reassuring in that Saint Barthélemy has the capacity to survive," notes Bruno Magras.

Nine New Villas In Flamands?

Criticism abounds for a massive project along the beach in Flamands: Approved by the executive council in January, this project entails nine villas, each with a

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swimming pool, plus a fitness center and spa.... To be built in a neighborhood that is already very densely populated!

Dorms Help Housing Crisis

The housing crisis is not over for many residents of Saint Barth who do not own homes. To help out, especially in the case of teachers and health workers, the Collectivity modified the rules concerning the dorms (generally used for short term stays) in Saint Jean, which can be used for a limited time by those who cannot find a place to rent.

Presidential Visit



On Sunday, September 30, the island was roused from its usually Sunday calm by a visit from French president Emmanuel Macron, who was visiting the French Antilles one year after hurricane Irma. In Saint Barth, this head of state was met by hundreds of supporters at the airport. After lunch at L'Esprit Jean-Claude Dufour in Saline, he met with those residents who were instrumental in getting the island back on its feet after Irma: builders, doctors, school principals...

Planning Map Partially Cancelled

The administrative court reserved three decisions concerning the new planning map (Rockefeller in Colombier, Saint Jean close to the airport, and several lots in Saline), while there were 14 appeals requesting that the map be cancelled all together. President Magras is said to be okay with this decision.



Sébastien Gréaux New Director of Territorial Environmental Agency

He knows the island like the back of his hand: this former agent for the marine park, who specializes in the underwater milieu, was appointed director of the ATE, replacing Olivier Raynaud, who left the island after three years at the head of the agency.

Eden Rock Will Not Open In 2018

They had planned to open on December 22, 2018, but that proved impossible in light of the amount of work to be done at the hotel on the beach in Saint Jean. On October 18, Eden Rock announced it would postpone its opening until the month of November 2019.

November

Domaine Félicité Opens Its Doors

Step back in time at Domaine Félicité in Public. Arlette and Alain Magras have transformed their family cottages into a heritage site that chronicles the history of Saint Barth. There is also a lovely garden with tropical plants.

The Horses Are Gone



Hurricane Irma wreaked havoc for Galops des Iles, with several horses killed, and others injured or traumatized by the storm. To avoid such a tragedy in the future, Galops des Iles decided to send the remaining horses to a peaceful retirement in France. They left the island on November 13 in special containers and arrived in good health. At the ranch in Gouverneur, there are two horses too old to make the trip, and seven Shetland ponies that will remain as part of a pedagogic farm at the site.

Laurence Belloeil and Fanny Marchesi Finish Their Adventure

Laurence Belloeil and Fanny Marchessi crossed the finish line of the Rebelle Rally 2018, after crossing hundreds of miles in a Jeep in the Nevada and California desert. Of the 42 teams that started, they finished in 19th place.

Gustavialoppet Won By Michel Pradel and Félicia Paines

The traditional Gustavialoppet once again attracted a large number of walkers and runners. First-timer Michel Pradel from Guadeloupe ran the 10km race in 37mn 14 sec, beating Husson from Saint Barth by 29 seconds. Félicia Paines from Saint Martin was the first woman to cross the finish line, with a time of 45mn 40sec.

Belgians Take The Cata Cup



Belgians, Bravo! It wasn't until the last race on Sunday, November 18 that the winners were known for the 2018 Saint-Barth Cata Cup. The Belgian duo of Patrick Demesmaeker and Olivier Gagliani took top honors, as they did in 2015. Second place went to Enrique Figueroa/Ruben Booth (Puerto Rico) and third place to Pablo Volker/Sergio Mehl (Argentina).

December

Tiru Becomes Dalkia Wastenergy

On December 3, leaders of Dalkia Wastenergy, including the managing director Sylvie Jéhanno, came to Saint Barth for the inauguration of the new trash and recycling center in Public. Those working there explained what they do, and the company was congratulated for its comprehensive trash treatment program.

Environment and Energy Conference

A week of sessions and fruitful exchanges, the island's first Environment and Energy Conference, organized by vice-president Micheline Jacques, was considered successful. Next step: revision of the Environmental Code, the new version of which should be presented in early 2019.

Road Safety Campaign

On December 6, the Collectivity launched a road safety campaign to help prevent accidents. Seven residents of the island are pictured in the ads for this

effort, which will be revived in early 2019, with a forum on road safety on January 12.

285 Kilos Of Cocaine Seized In Saint Martin

Second large drug bust of the year for the customs agents in Saint Martin, who went into action in the bay of Grand Case on December 3, seizing 285 kilos of cocaine aboard a "go-fast" cigarette boat. Two of the three men aboard were able to escape by swimming to the shore, but the third, a Venezuelan, was arrested.

Autour du Rocher Building Permit Cancelled

The administrative court sided with a neighboring family regarding the Autour du Rocher property in Lorient: the building permit authorized by the Collectivité de Saint-Barthélemy for a villa with 12 bedrooms was eventually refused due to insufficient green space, as per the classification of this land in the regulations accompanying the planning map.

First Sports Trophies Presented



Ten exceptional young athletes who represent Saint Barthélemy on a national and international level were honored during the island's first Sports Trophy ceremony on Friday, December 21. The Collectivity presented each one with a trophy, and used the occasion to also thank those who have worked hard over the years for the development of local sports.
