News Briefs

New Species Seen In Waters Around St Barth





In its most recent newsletter, the Territorial Environmental Agency (ATE) noted the sighting of a group of 10 juveniles of the fish species *micropogonias furnieri*, or whitemouth croaker. "This species had not been seen before in Saint Barthélemy or other Petites Antilles islands. The photographs and videos taken that day are also the only ones known of such specimens in our waters," explains the ATE.

Route du Rhum Boats At Les Voiles



In less than three months, in mid-April, the 10th edition of Les Voiles de Saint-Barth will set sail. Among the 50 entries are several boats that participated in the 2018 Route du Rhum.

Expected in the Rhum Mono category is Marseille architect Nicolas Magnan at the helm of Javelot, which arrived in eighth place in Guadeloupe after a difficult 30-day transatlantic crossing.

Keep an eye out for such multihull entries as: Class winner in the Rhum Multi category, the 15-meter trimaran Olmix, whose French captain Pierre Antoine offered emergency help to Lalou Roucayrol after he capsized in mid-Atlantic; and the 50-ft trimaran Rayon Vert, which Alain Delhumeau finished seventh in the same category; along with Bertrand De Broc's catamaran, Pampero; and Christian Guyader with Guyader Gastronomiea in 11th place, but which stood out last year by winning first place in the IMRR Multihull class at Les des Voiles de St. Barth Richard Mille.

And from the Multi 50 class at the Route du Rhum, where he took fourth place, Gilles Lamiré with French Tech Caraibos, will sail once again in the IMRR Multihull class.

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Monthly Sunday Market In Gustavia

A wonderful new island tradition is the Saint Barth Market held the first Sunday of every month in Gustavia on Rue Général-de-Gaulle (the cobblestone street running from Le Select toward Les Artisans). Organized by the Collectivité, the first of these openair Sunday markets was held last April and was an immediate success with the local population, as well as with tourists. Shop owners and artisans present their wares, and the long line of cars heading into town creates a traffic jam (better to park on the outskirts and walk a bit). What can one find at this market? Generally speaking, the most popular stands are those of the bakeries, which sell bread, brioche, and pastry, while the traditional West Indian cuisine from Cré'age and vegan specialties by Alice always attract a crowd, as does the ice cream seller. One can also find clothing, local jewelers, imported fruit and vegetables, artisanal products such as soap and hand-turned wood, work by local artists, coffee and rum... Anywhere from 20 to 40 stands (depending on the month) are open from 8am to 12pm. The next Saint Barth Market takes place on Sunday, February 3, 2019.

Chilly?

Has this winter been especially cool in Saint Barthélemy? Not really. To date, the average temperature for the month of January is right on target: 23.2°C or 73.6°F. The thermostat has not gone above an average of 24.6 °C or 76.2°F by day, while the lowest temperature recorded was on January 2 at 21.8°C or 71.2°F. That is far from the lowest temperature on record, which was a cool 19.5 °C or 67.1°F on January 24, 1976. Rain fell only five days in January, compared to an average of 11.5 days, as calculated between 1981 and 2010.

Success For First Art & Food Market At Pati de St Barth

A Sunday market mixing food and art took place in Saint Barth on January 20, with brunch items cooked by chefs from some of the island's leading hotels, and art ateliers for kids and adults, as well as artists' work on display along with plants and vegan food by Alice. This first Art & Food Market, organized by the Artists of Saint Barth association at the Pati de St Barth boutique in Saint Jean (across from Villa Creole), was deemed a big success. The next such market will take place on Sunday, February 17 in the same location, 10am-2pm.

Saint Barth Dream: A Caribbean Art Destination

To add another dimension to the island's appeal, the Tourism Committee has put a focus on art, in association with the Artists of Saint-Barth. The first Art Week, February 4-9, is the fruit of this collaboration.

he island is the perfect place to be creative! As tiny as it is, Saint Barth attracts artists of all genres, who work in sculpture, painting, photography, wood... The Tourism Committee (CTTSB) sees this as an additional attraction for the island. "We world like to see art to play a key role in maintaining the loyalty of our upscale clientele, as well as place the island of Saint Barthélemy in a leading position as a top art destination in the Caribbean islands," says Nils Dufau, president of the CTTSB.

With this in mind, the first Art Week will be held on February 4-9, based on photography. The idea for the event is along the same lines as the Gourmet Festival: five exhibits, each at a luxury hotel for a week, with a special event each evening at which the artist can meet the public and present his work.

"We are always looking for other things to show tourists than just our beaches," says Marie-Laure Belzic, director of the CTTSB. Naturally, she turned to the Artists of Saint-Barth, an association that organizes Pop Up Art Parties at the Christopher Hotel and other island locations. These events attract hundreds of people, residents as well as visitors. "That's what creates the charm of Saint Barthélemy. We would like to keep it like that, where residents and tourists mix."

The first Saint Barth Art Week was announced during a gala dinner hosted by the CTTSB in Paris in December. Photographer Antoine Verglas was named patron of the event: "Photography is mature and diverse enough in Saint Barth to warrant its own event, presenting high-quality photographers whose work is complementary," he notes. That is also the modus operandi for Artists of Saint-Barth, as represented by director Emmanuel Leprince: "I insist that the all of the exhibits are of high quality." Thus year, photography is in the spotlight, "but we would like to support different disciplines for each edition," points out Marie Laure Belzic.

This artistic spirit is growing on the island, from Art Parties to Art Week, and the second annual Photo Festival planned for this summer, not to mention the exhibits at the Territorial Museum, which have expanded from year to year.

"St Barthélemy is already renowned for its beaches, villas, and hotels. It is now equally regarded for its artistic creation, with a spirit of healthy competition and an active market with buyers among the owners of villas on the island and visitors who appreciate contemporary art. This vitality is what Art Week hopes to capture by presenting an exceptional experience in an exceptional place," adds jeweler Fabienne Miot.

The organizers hope that Art Week will become an annual event as successful as the Gourmet Festival has become. "Something new to add to our calendar, hoping it becomes an important event that allows us to accent the attractiveness of the island through art... The art of being an island," concludes Nils Dufau.

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The Ball Is Rolling

Pati Guyot, who arrived in Saint Barth in 1983, has been an artist since childhood. She has observed and been part of the art movement on the island. In an annex of her French West Indies boutique in St Jean, she houses a mini art gallery, 100% local.

he island has really changed since 1983, the year that Pati Guyot arrived in Saint Barthélemy. "When I got here, there were very few artists, but they were very good," she recalls. "We formed a small collective and displayed our work where we could, that is to say in very few places.... We borrowed a large space in Gustavia, which was great. But as the years went by, it became more complicated to show our work. Art galleries opened but generally showed artists from the exterior. And it is hard to make a gallery successful, especially with little-known artists ..." As a result, the collective disappeared little-by-little.

Today, the Artists of Saint-Barth association, which has 50 members including Pati, rents an annex at her French West Indies boutique in Saint Jean. This mini gallery is as much a meeting place as an exhibit space, And the back deck allows for outside events. such as the Art & Food Market, the first one of which was held on January 20. Small but visible. thanks to the art that adorn the facade, Pati's gallery attracts the attention of the many tourists who stop to take a look. And if folks like Doug Barrowman are rare he decorated his entire villa with art from Saint Barth, investing several hundred thousand euros (as reported in the Journal de St Barth #1290)— more and more tourists and art connoisseurs appreciate and purchase work by local artists.



Is Saint Barthélemy particularly inspiring? "In my opinion, if there are so many artists, it's maybe due to a slight lack of cultural activities. Other than the beaches and a few places to hike, you have to find something to do. And since the island is so beautiful, it incites artistic creation. The décor is as good as it gets," says Pati, who notes that it seems a no-brainer to develop the artistic facet of the island. "What would really be

interesting would be to create an artistic movement native to Saint Barth, like there was in Haiti at one time. People get together and that creates cross-fertilization, stimulates creativity. Today, I think that the ball is rolling. With enough support, the art movement is growing in magnitude. And will allow us to attract people who are interested in art, that is to say, an upscale, cultivated clientele."


