One of these is the massive demand for electricity, the need to produce it by burning fossil fuel, and the desire to migrate to renewable energy in the near future. Covid-19 Epidemic Shows Slight Decrease In Saint Barth

The December 18 epidemiological report from the French Public Health Service shows two new positive cases of the Coronavirus for the week of December 7-13, and seven cases last week. The cases were confirmed for patients between the ages of 15 and 64, all residing in Saint Barthélemy. These nine positive cases of Covid19, reflecting a slight decrease in the number of new cases, were identified via PCR and antigen tests. With only 10 doctor visits for Severe Respiratory Infections and no emergency room reports for suspicion of Covid-19, the reduction of the circulation of the virus is confirmed. During her visit to the island

last week, Valérie Denux, director of the Regional Health Agency for Guadeloupe, noted, "The situation is under control. The number of cases doesn't mean much on the island as it's small, it's the positivity rate that is important and that remains low. The major concern now are the holidays. Today the level of the virus is down, but the holidays could cause a rapid increase, because, yes, the virus is on the island." Since August 3, two patients from Saint Barth were evacuated and placed in intensive care. One death has been reported here since the beginning of pandemic last February. A total of 182 cases have been confirmed since March 2020.

Jewelry Store Robbed In Gustavia



Early Wednesday evening, December 16, three masked men carrying guns robbed the Diamond Genesis boutique in Gustavia. After tying up the two employees in the store as well as two clients who arrived on the scene, the robbers stole high-priced jewelry and watches. "We suppose it was a great loss. At this time the actual amount of the

loot has not been confirmed," indicated the gendarmerie the next day. RCI (Radio Caribbean International) mentioned a sum of 2M€.

The robbers fled on scooters, which they abandoned in Public. After that, there are several hypotheses. Technicians from Saint Martin came to support the gendarmes, and the case is still under investigation.

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The Collectivity Adopts A Local Energy Code

Since 2007, the Collectivity has been responsible for energy, rather than the French government. It took until December 2020 for the territorial council to vote on a local energy code. A fundamental document.

During their final meeting of the year, the territorial council members debated the first version of a local energy code. The creation of its own code represents a fundamental step for the Collectivity. Renewing certain national requirements is a condition to guarantee to maintaining fair prices, in other words, France pays for extra costs related to the remoteness of the island, allowing residents to not have their EDF bills double or triple. This code is also essential to receive aid from FACE, which has been financing the placing of our electric wires underground since Irma, to the tune of 8M€. It also provides a framework, with legal protection so that each partner (French government, Collectivity, EDF) can calmly play its role. In addition, the absence of an agreement made it impossible for the EDF to invest in replacing the old motors at their electric plant in Public. The guarantee by the French government to maintain the price adjustment has reassured the EDF group. But the government wants it clearly understood that the taxes on fuel collected by the Collectivity are not financed by France, but by the consumers, who will see the sum reflected on their bills (an increase of 20% over three years is planned starting in 2021). The Collectivity is thus reassured that they can manage their energy without losing the preferential rates.

A Goal of 50% Renewable In 10 Years

And what about the future? Today, the entirety of the electricity pro-



duced on the island is from fossil fuel brought by cargo ship and burned in the motors at the plant in Public. Energy security, but nothing could be worse in terms of the environment (Yet Saint Barth is far from being the only place in the world to use thermal energy, far from it, especially for an island). However, on an island that has the means, and where its image is important, and the desire of the population can be heard, Saint Barth is late in its transition to new forms of energy. The solar panel project for the roof of the incinerator has been stopped due to cement dust that covers the neighborhood. New public buildings (post office in Lorient, medico-social center) do not have any solar panels either. Other than aid for individuals for the installation of solar or thermal panels, which is not too frequently used, there aren't any ambitious projects on the island. However, the time has come because after the energy

code, next comes the PPE, currently being written. This multi-annual energy project defines the level of renewable energy desired by 2030 and beyond, and by what means, by creating a precise blueprint.

Decreasing The Demand

Before embarking on an ecological transition, the first thing that has to happen is to cut energy use. With that in mind, a MDE (manage the demand for energy) committee was created last year and will get to work very seriously in the months to come. On an island like ours, there are a lot of questions and the answers are pretty clear: it is really necessary to heat the pool? Is it necessary to air-condition the entire house all year long? To cool the shops while leaving the doors open? Or installing huge glass doors facing south?

Five Firefighters Honored For Acts Of Courage

On the feast day for Sainte Barbe, the patron saint of firefighters, five representatives of the territorial fire department were officially honored for their acts of courage and sense of duty, with one of them, Thomas Charmillon, receiving a special medal of honor. In November 2019, they saved a man in danger of death, by the natural pools in Petit-Cul-de-Sac.

The victim is deeply indebted to them. On Sunday, November 3, 2019, this Lithuanian was swimming in the natural pools in Petit-Cul-de-Sac in bad weather, when he was carried away by a wave. The firefighters took great risk in the rescue operation. After being alerted by an eyewitness, they ran to the location on foot. Thomas Charmillon threw himself into the water to reach the drowning man, who was exhausted after over an hour in the water. Attached by a rope to the other firefighters who remained on dry land, Charmillon could not climb back up the rocks with the victim. Luckily the SNSM, on its way back from helping a boat in difficulty off the coast of Gustavia, came to the rescue. Charmillon managed to help the man get aboard their boat, the SNS 269 Capitaine

Danet, in spite of very rough seas. The victim survived the fright of his life, weary but in good health.

A year later, the five firefighters who participated in this operation were officially honored for their services at the Sainte Barbe celebration in early December. Thomas Charmillon was singled out and awarded a bronze medal for his “act of courage and devotion.” The four others received an official letter of congratulations: lieutenant Christophe Laurens, sergeant-chef Aude Vermillard, volunteer corporal Karine Brin, and volunteer 1st class Timothy Lepinay.

Other than this distinction for a specific intervention, 17 members of Saint Barth’s fire squad “who have constantly shown proof of their devotion,” as per a pre-

fectural decree, also received a medal at this event, based on their years of service. A bronze medal went to Gilles Alayrangues, Yves Aubin, Thierry Brin, Frédéric Clavier, Michel Gréaux, Willy Maxor, Alice Questel, Fabrice Questel, Aurélien Rasse,

Laurent Riviere, and Patrick Riviere. A silver medal was presented to Patrick Blanchard, Bernard Gendrey, Sébastien Jan, Richard Ramassamy, and Aude Vermillard. And finally, Christophe Lepinay was honored with a gold medal.

Science Fair Delights Local School Kids

Students from all of the island's schools participated in a Science Fair, organized by the Saint-Barth Heritage association. During field trips in Colombier, they even enriched the database of the National Natural History Museum.

On December 7-11, Saint-Barth Heritage invited the school kids in Saint Barth to participate in a week of exploration.

For an hour each morning, accompanied by Anne Querrard-Lamouler, a specialist from the associations, the students, equipped with their cameras, were transformed into little scientists doing their photo-journalism. Their itinerary started at the outlook point in Colombier, offering a breathtaking view of the island and out to the horizon, before taking the little path to observe the local flora and fauna. The goal of this expedition? Fill in the database for INPN Species* at the National Natural History Museum, in which "Saint Barth was not even mentioned until a few weeks ago," according to Anne Querrard-Lamouler.

Students On A Mission

To explain this ecosystem, with its wealth of various species, Querrard-Lamouler has a wide selection of brochures but also specific knowledge and a unique pedagogical approach. The students feel invested in the mission they were on, while learning from their mistakes thanks to her advice, because one cannot improvise when it comes to photography, there are certain rules to respect: "You need good composition, and to make sure the image is in focus and that the subjects are not shot in silhouette, while making sure your hands or feet are not in front of the lens..." it is fascinating to see how the students feel involved when you explain things clearly to them, even if you have to repeat it once or twice.



local flora and fauna to the kids and encourage them to want to learn more.

No doubt that after this experience, the students will be interested in knowing more about their surroundings. That is the hope of the Saint-Barth Heritage associations, which hopes to renew this experience as soon as possible.

Ofer, an Israeli businessman who resides in Monaco.

Since December 1st, 158 yachts over 20 meters in length have entered the Port of Gustavia, with a total of 224 passengers and more than 800 crew members. Currently there are over 30 large yachts at the dock or in the harbor, including five that measure over 70 meters long. Several even larger yachts, more than 100 meters in length, are expected for the holidays.
