## COLLECTIVITÉ'S NEW RULES AGAINST NOISE POLLUTION

Two new decrees, dated November 10 and November 23, add to the Collectivité's arsenal of rules and regulations to fight against noise pollution on the island. Particularly in the goal to "regulate construction work." The first decree concerns work done by construction companies and individuals comprising the use of jack hammers or concrete cutters. Such work is now regulated as follows: Monday through Friday, 7am to 12pm and 2pm to 5pm; and

7am to 12pm and 3pm to 5pm in the area around schools. On Saturday, construction companies can work from 7am to 12pm ("with the exception of hydraulic rock crushers, electric or pneumatic jack hammers, or concrete cutters" according to the Collectivité). Individuals can work at home from 8:30am to 12pm and 3pm to 5pm, including gardening and odd jobs. On Sunday and holidays, there is a total interdiction of noise for businesses and individuals.

# A Wave Of Mortality For Diadem Sea Urchins: Why ?

**After a wave of mortality for diadem sea urchins, professor Elizabeth Duermit Moreau of the University of Florida, an ecologist specializing in the diseases of crustaceans, came to St Barthélemy for four days to take samples from 25 sea urchins. This was done at five different sites in order to widen the research into their death in a genetic manner.**



After her visit, the Territorial Environmental Agency (ATE) started to capture larvae based on a procedure created by the Van Hall Larenstein University of Applied Sciences in Saba. Two distinct structures were installed using biodegradable elements: palm fronds from the *coccothrinax barbadensis* (a protected species of palm tree), the *antogonum leptopus* creeping vine (an invasive species that grows over plants until they are deprived of light which retards their

development), and agave sisal, also considered invasive.

In the shape of a ball, or woven, these elements should provide the larvae a means of protection from their predators—various fish, bacteria, mollusks, and micro crabs. This phase of the test was to determine which of the four vegetal fibers degrades the slowest over time, and in keeping with the life cycle of the sea urchin, from larva to its juvenile form.

## REPLANTING SEAGRASS BEDS AT FORCHUE

In its last bulletin, the Territorial Environmental Agency (ATE) noted the replanting of seagrass beds at Fourchue. The ATE remarks: “Since hurricane Irma, the *Thalassia* marine seagrass remains uprooted from the seafloor and is vulnerable to cyclonic swells. At the end of August, the staff of the ATE, with the help of volunteers from Island Nature Saint Barth Experiences and the Coral Restoration association, worked to remedy this precarious situation by collecting three root balls and reimplanting them at Fourchue. In fact, the *Thalassia testudinum*, commonly known as turtle grass, had disappeared from the bay of Fourchue due to erosion of the soil caused by the intensive grazing of wild goats on the island, which resulted in sedimentation of the bay, which in turn was fatal for this underwater plant.”

To date, the *Thalassia* has not succeeded in recolonizing the seafloor of the bay. However, since the goats were removed in 2004, the ATE has observed that much of the vegetation has grown back. “Primarily in the principal ravine where we could observe a torrent of mud during heavy rains, but that is no longer the case today,” explains the agency. The return of Caribbean seagrass (*Halophila decipiens*) and manatee grass (*Syringodium filiforme*) indicates that the physical and physiological conditions are favorable for the re-emergence of turtle grass (*Thalassia testudinum*).

# Instagrammable Species: At What Price?

Every year, it's the same story: Curiosity leads to behavior that has negative consequences for local flora and fauna. With this in mind, the Territorial Environmental Agency (ATE) once again calls attention to the dangers that certain practices represent for many species found in Saint Barthélemy. Their message is addressed to visitors as well as seasonal workers and residents.

## Destructive Selfies

"The beaches of Saint Barth are especially appreciated for their turquoise water and white sand," notes Karl Questel of the ATE. Just type such hashtags as #stbarths or #saintbarth on Instagram to see the many posts by tourists, as well as residents, that often hide negative consequences. Two species are often seen in such selfies: sea turtles and starfish. But behind these selfies, seeking "likes" for their authors, is hidden a different reality for these animals: panic, fear, fleeing, asphyxiation, incessant disruption while trying to feed..." This reality obviously escapes the authors of these "nature" photos,

because all they are doing is adding their own version to the millions of similar images already circulating online.


In this long series of "classics" so over-immortalized as to become banal, is the sexy shot with a starfish. "Taking a starfish out of the water means it cannot breathe as long as it is out of the sea," Questel explains. "It risks asphyxi-

ation, which is really understandable. But what can be done?" Pleading ignorance is often a response to this question, but starfish are not the only species to suffer in the race to post the image that gets the most "likes."

Sea turtles are also part of the "must be seen" species, says Questel with regret. "In certain bays, they adapt to the presence of

swimmers, and can even ignore them completely,” explains the scientist. “To best enjoy the spectacle, it is best to do nothing, or just float alongside them. To touch one, or worse, hold on to its carapace, is the best way to make it flee, or cause it to distrust you. In addition, it is completely forbidden to touch sea turtles as they are a protected species. They also seek nutrition almost all day and bothering them forces them to leave a spot that is safe for them, and find another spot that is too risky, in zones with many boats or exposed to sharks.” To top it all off, if the intrusive photographer thinks they are being original, there is no point in trying to tell them that a selfie with a sea turtle is without doubt one of the most widespread images. So not at all original, yet parasitic for the species. “Even the most patient sea turtles have their limits,” insists Questel.

**Harmful “Sound and Light” Soirées**

And yet, sadly for the turtles, such perturbations and threats do not come solely from selfies. In fact, many other things are harmful to them. “Sound and light” soirées on the beaches at night

are another problem. “If during the day the beaches are full of swimmers, at night various animals use them to seek nourishment in the shelter of darkness,” says Questel. Herons, crabs, and especially sea turtles take advantage of the dark and calm to lay their eggs. Very susceptible to perturbations, a female sea turtle returns immediately to the water if she realizes that the beach is not safe. After several unsuccessful attempts, she will deposit her eggs directly into the sea, destroying a hundred eggs all at once.”

Without going into more minute

details, the ATE mentions various nautical activities during which “sailors” do not respect the 5-knot speed limit within 200 meters of the shore, or the “use of motorized foils which are more and more popular, yet are actually swift little guillotines.” And they ask the following question: “If an amusement is really harmful to endangered species that are on their way to extinction, is it really amusing?” Those concerned could undoubtedly provide an answer between two exhilarating sessions of nautical sports.

SAINT BARTH AND ITS BIODIVERSITY

Atlantic goliath grouper

**Where does it live?**

The largest bony fish in the Atlantic: its maximum size is 250 cm and it weighs up to 363 kg; it lives beyond 37 years; its sexual maturity is 110 cm for males and 120 cm for females.



# Saint Barth As Seen

The island may have been in the doldrums during the pandemic, but a perfect remedy for the Saint Barth blues can be found in a new book, “St Barthélemy, Land & Sea,” with photographs by Rosemond Gréaux and Edmund Gudenas.

The beauty of Saint Barthélemy unfolds in this book by these partners-in-crime, as it were, who have spent many years photographing all aspects of the island: Rosemond Gréaux and Edmund Gudenas share new and archival images, with short texts by Ellen Lamper-Gréaux and graphic design by Florence Voix. An American originally from Ohio, Edmund Gudenas spends his winters in Saint Barth and this is not his first photographic outing, as he has already published two oversized books with views of the island: “St Barth Souvenirs” in 2018 and “St Barth XL” in 2013.

“This is a project we thought about doing for a long time,” recalls Saint Barth native Rosemond Gréaux. “Ed and I met for the first time in the late 90s. My wife Ellen and I saw him taking lots of wonderful pictures at Le Select. Over the years, we became friends and started talking about doing a photography book together. I like to say he became my acolyte in taking local photos.”



Sports editor and photographer at Le Journal de Saint-Barth for over two decades, Rosemond suffered an illness that kept him from working for the better part of a year, but he didn’t forget this project: “In December 2019, I decided to search in my archives for some of the best photos I had taken for Le Journal de Saint-Barth as well as for Harbour Magazine over the years. I spent many hours with my computer to select them!”

The title of the book, “Land & Sea,” was not chosen by chance. “Ed is fascinated by Saint Barthélemy, its landscapes, its horizons, and its festivities on land,” explains Rosemond, “while I was more at home out on the waves.

get close to the racing boats to capture the moment and immortalize the sailors in action. As for Ed, he takes nine or ten successive photos of the same scene and links them together with special software.”

A book that is only surprising in that it represents just a tiny fraction of the photos these two friends have taken over the years. “For me, this book is just the first, I hope to publish a few more,” concludes Rosemond.

When you browse the pages of the book, perhaps you will catch a glimpse of yourself. In fact, if you participated in a sports event, a regatta, Carnival, or a party at Le Select, you just might be in the pages of this island souvenir.

As a sports journalist, I covered an incalculable number of regattas such as The Bucket, The Cata Cup, Les Voiles de Saint-Barth Richard Mille, and the Transat. So, it was natural for me to concentrate on the nautical section of the book.”

The photos are all impressive, from one to the next, thanks to individual techniques: “Over the years I refined my way of taking photos of the different sports events,” says Rosemond. “For example, for the regattas, I go out in a small motorboat with a pilot. That allows me to
