Firefighters of St Barth: Celebrations, Interventions, and Modernization

The Barth's territorial firefighters celebrated their patron saint, Sainte Barbe, on the weekend of December 3-4. This annual fete comprises events for the public and an official ceremony. From games for kids at the fire station and sporting events at Les Mangliers to a parade in the streets of Gustavia... it was, as it is every year, a major celebration. But it was also time for a report about their activities over the course of the past year.

1,121 Interventions In 2022

During the ceremony at the fire station in Saint Jean, lieutenant Christophe Laurens, commander of the local firefighters, made his report in front of a group of officials. He explained that there have been 1,121 interventions since the beginning of 2022. Last year, at the same time, there were only 856 such actions. "The reason for the increase is mostly due to the absence of medical transportation on the island," explains lieutenant Laurens. As a consequence, the firefighters are also obligated to serve as ambulance drivers. For example, in 2022, there were more than 90 medical evacuations.

In parallel to this high level of activity in 2022, the fire brigade is also in the process of modernization. First in terms of new vehicles, as well as improving their readiness for hurricane season with additional training and coordination exercises with other services, etc.

The brigade has reinforced its medical service with the arrival of doctor Pauline Caudron. The firefighters also took part in various training sessions away from Saint Barth, including medical training, piloting of drones, aquatic rescues, and interventions inside of nautical vessels.

In 2023, recruitment will be a main focus. They have already launched a campaign to engage new firefighters; a need that is more and more pressing due to the everincreasing number of people on the island, especially during high season. Candidates can pick up an application form at the fire station in St Jean, which will soon be replaced by a newer, larger station currently under construction.

UNICEF Gala On Site Of Former Emeraude Place Hotel

his year's LuisaViaRoma UNICEF gala will take place in Saint Barth on Thursday, December 29. Rather than at Eden Rock like last year, the event will be on the site of the former Emeraude Plage Hoel in Saint Jean. The organizers decided to keep the gala in Saint Jean, yet the exact spot is a but unexpected as it's just a big sandy lot.

Since the decision handed down on December 23, 2021 by the administrative in Basse-Terre (Guadeloupe), which invalidated the two building permits issued by the Collectivité to the SAS Saint Jean Real Beach Estate Invest for the Hotel Etoile, the land has been being returned to its natural state. That was a legal obligation of the verdict. "The land was filled in and has been secured." confirms Xavier Lédée, president of the Collectivité, who confirms that everything related to the organization of this event will be "closely monitored."

The Collectivité was asked to make a temporary storage area available to the organizers. This is located in Saint Jean, behind the stadium. "They asked if they could pay us for using it, but I suggested instead that they raffle prizes for the benefit of other islands in need, such as Haiti. to show the solidarity of Saint Barthélemy," indicates Lédée, who adds: "This is an event that will impact daily life in the neighborhood and the island. WE are going to have meetings with the organizers, the territorial police, and the gendarmerie. Primary to discuss such questions as

parking and traffic, so everything runs as smoothly as possible." Last year, in spite of the efforts made by the organizers, there were still disturbances that resulted in many comments and criticisms by the population.

Five buildings, including one which is rather imposing, will be constructed on this former hotel site for the night of the gala. They will be used, respectively, for photos as the guests arrive, a cocktail party, dressing rooms for the musicians, and a catering area. The fifth space, which is the largest, is the main venue for the dinner and the concert. "A security commission will stop by 11

days before the event to make an inspection," explains Lédée.

The website for Cornucopia Events reveals certain details about the gala event on Thursday, December 29. The evening starts with a cocktail party, a gala dinner, and a charity auction to raise money for UNICEF projects that help children in need. Plus, a concert by Lenny Kravitz and Drake. Other celebrities include Adriana Lima, John Legend, Chrissy Teigen, Katy Perry, Ricky Martin, Dua Lipa, Orlando Bloom, Heidi Klum, Emily Ratajkowski, Vanessa Hudgens, and others. Ticket prices vary from 17,000 to 40,000 euros per person, or 145,000 to 405,000 euros per table of 12. In 2021, the gala raised 4 million euros.

The awards ceremony, which will include an auction for the benefit of the SNSM (French National Rescue At Sea Association) and a display of the 10 best photos, will take place during

Monaco Classic Week, organized by the Monaco Yacht Club for traditional sailing yachts and vintage motorboats, September 13-16, 2023 (In 2024 the ceremony will be in Saint Barth at Manapany).

Two New Traffic Circles In Saint Jean

On November 17, the Collectivité put out a call for proposals for a feasibility study for the construction of a traffic circle in Saint Jean. This will be located by the exit to the airport. But it will not be the only new infrastructure of its kind to be built in Saint Jean. In fact, a second traffic circle will be added by the exit of the new fire station in Saint Jean (which is being built across from the old station). A third traffic circle, currently at the entry to Les Mangliers, will be moved, and repositioned closer to the center of the road that leads to the sports stadium. These projects should get underway in 202

Collectivité's New Rules Against Noise Pollution

Two new decrees, dated November 10 and November 23, add to the Collectivité's arsenal of rules and regulations to fight against noise pollution on the island. Particularly in the goal to "regulate construction work." The first decree concerns work done by construction companies and individuals comprising the use of jack hammers or concrete cutters. Such work is now regulated as follows: Monday through Friday, 7am to 12pm and 2pm to 5pm; and 7am to 12pm and 3pm to 5pm in the area around schools. On Saturday, construction companies can work from 7am to 12pm ("with the exception of hydraulic rock crushers, electric or pneumatic jack hammers, or concrete cutters" according to the Collectivité). Individuals can work at home from 8:30am to 12pm and 3pm to 5pm, including gardening and odd jobs. On Sunday and holidays, there is a total interdiction of noise for businesses and individuals.

Aitken's video projects involve the perceptual, narrative, and poetic possibilities opened up by a constantly changing global technological environment.

Combres and Mannerheim note: "We are at a moment where we see first-hand the daily destruction of the environment caused by society. Being in St Barth, we are surrounded by the magnificent blue ocean and we jointly want to protect what we love."

About the Underwater Pavilions

The Underwater Pavilions are both aesthetic and scientific and put the local marine environment and the global challenges around ocean conversation in dialogue with the history of art, inviting the viewer to write a contemporary narrative of the ocean and to participate in its protection.

The work consists of three temporary underwater sculptures, floating beneath the ocean's surface that swimmers, snorkelers, and scuba divers swim through and experience. Geometric in design, the sculptures create underwater spaces synthesizing art and science as they are constructed with carefully researched materials and will be moored to the ocean floor. Part of each structure is mirrored to reflect the underwater seascape and create a kaleidoscopic observatory for the viewer, while other surfaces are rough and rock-like.
