On February 28, the Saint Barthélemy International Property Owners Association held a fund-raising event at Eden Rock's Sand Bar restaurant. Proceeds from the event have been donated to the Saint National Rescue At Sea Association. You know, the orange boat parked at the dock in Gustavia. They get basic funding from the Collectivité but need to pay for their fuel, cost of training, transportation to St. Martin for the training, and all materials and equipment. One often sees them on the dock or at the market selling t-shirts and caps to raise money. How many baseball caps for a new boat? All joking aside, when there is a big regatta like The Bucket, which took place in Saint Barth last weekend, these are the guys on call to deal with any emergencies at sea: when the call comes they have a 20minute window to leave their home or place of work, change clothes, and get the boat out on the water. Let's hope they aren't needed too often, but they are there when and if. I like to think of them as the little boat that can... and hope we can all continue to support their valiant efforts.

# St Barth Bucket: Nakupenda Sails To Victory

St Barth Bucket regular and first-time winner, the 34-meter Danish Yachts sloop Nakupenda went into the final day of this three-day regatta on Sunday, March 19, 2023 in a three-way tie with Bequia and Action (finishing second and third, respectively, in their class, Les Mademoiselles). Nakupenda won the coveted overall Bucket trophy and will be engraved on the elegant Hermès Perpetual Trophy. "I'm over the top about it," said Nakupenda's owner/driver Steve Rowland, explaining that this is his fourth Bucket with Nakupenda and his first class win, not to mention overall victory, which is decided by a number of factors including performance and time differentials.

Nakupenda's time-gaining and perhaps ultimately winning move, according to Nakupenda's tactician Stu Ballantyne, was passing inside of the 50-meter Almyra II (L'Esprit 2 class) at the Petite Groupers. "Our navigator said we had room, so we did it, passing very close to the rocks." He added that the team also made some changes after having some trouble with spinnaker take-downs: "We needed to make the boat and our maneuvers more reliable, so we changed the system for how we managed the drops. It minimized the risk of damage and definitely improved our performance. In fact, we improved in all areas every day."

Sunday's race was not what was originally planned. Even with winds of 18-24 knots. giving sailors somewhat of a reprieve from the 20-26 knots that prevailed on Friday and Saturday, it was decided to change course: "The wind and sea state was definitely at the upper end for some boats, and certainly for the Race Committee. "Typically, we sail around the island on Sunday, but we made a decision to keep the boats in the lee of St. Barth for the larger part of today's race with a course option that was newly added to the Bucket this year," explains race chairman Peter Craig.

"The feedback from owners and crews has been as positive as I can recall regarding the 2023 edition," adds Craig. "As mentioned at the final awards ceremony, history was made on Sunday with a custom race course in play. Expectations were for the traditional 'Wrong Way Around' course and there was a great deal of worry about the sea state on the northeast end of the island. The custom course was an interesting, unique course west and south of the island which helped minimize

damage and produced a fair race to wrap up the regatta. The surge in the harbor precluded many of the entrants from bringing their yachts to the dock, which was unfortunate, but we'll hope for better luck next year."

Other class winners include the 33-meter WinWin (Les Gazelles) 47.7-meter Wisp (Les Elegantes), 51.7-meter Red Dragon (L'Esprit 1) and the 43-meter Columbia, which was the only vessel to win all three races in their class (L'Esprit 2)

Making an annual donation to a worthy nonprofit activity on the island, The Bucket will present a check to the Youth Sailing Program at the Saint Barth Yacht Club for a minimum of 6,000 euros. This represents a portion of the entry fee and proceeds from the sale of the regatta posters. The SBYC and their members play an active role as on-water and shoreside volunteers at the Bucket each year.

"The Bucket was blessed with three great race days," notes Jeanne Kleene, event manager for The Bucket. "The winds were strong and challenging but the competitors and race committee prevailed! The custom course was a Bucket first, but it is allowed for in the Sailing Instructions. Thirtyone excellent programs came to St Barths to experience all that is special about the St Barth and the Bucket: twenty five racing yachts and six "non-racing." This is something new and quite exciting. Those yachts, both power and sail, join all the social activities and have a great spot on the course for viewing. I'm delighted to hear how many racing yachts are telling me that they had a great week and will be back next year. St Barth and its people are very special,"

# A New Agreement And Medals At The Red Cross

**♦** he much-awaited visit to Saint Barth by Philippe Da Costa, president of the French Red Cross, took place on March 2, 2023. He had been on the road, stopping in various French territories for the past 18 months, but had not yet made it to the Northern Islands. He only stayed a few hours but used the time wisely to meet with the volunteer staff on the island and to sign an agreement with the Collectivité. As well as present medals to those volunteers who have given their time to the local Red Cross for 10 years or longer.

"For me, this visit is an opportunity to see the level of commitment on our behalf and our responses to the population," explained the president during his meeting with the volunteers at the Red Cross store in Gustavia. "We are a hands-on organization," he added with enthu-

siasm. "The social and solidarity aspects are very important. It is such a pleasure to be here and meet you in order to add your faces to my map of the world."

President of the Red Cross in Saint Barth, Christine Moizan, was pleased with the visit by Philippe Da Costa: "Our goal is that you have a better image, as exact as possible, when you leave," she said to her president. The meeting with the volunteers was interrupted as everyone went over to the Hôtel de la Collectivité to sign an agreement for the creation of a specialized prevention center both in Saint Barth and in Saint Martin.

"The idea is to support the young people who are the most vulnerable," explains Da Costa, "to help them be an active part of society and prevent marginalization." This project will primarily be run by the Red Cross in Saint Martin, in concert with the Red Cross in Saint Barthélemy. A specialized teacher and a coordinator will be hired before the school year starts in September, and an annual budget of 160,000 euros will be needed for operational costs.

Another important aspect of Da Costa's visit was with the four most long-term volunteers: Arlette Romney (since 2012), Michèle Vaillot (2010), Denise Redon (2009,) and Marie Gast (2008), who were each presented with a silver medal for their commitment. "A big bravo and huge thanks for your devotion and your daily smile," noted Christine Moizan, addressing the four medal bearers.

After leaving the Northern Islands, Da Costa flew to Guadeloupe, where he continued his tour of the French islands for two days.

## PAVILIONS "EMERGED"

The major art exhibit held at the Wall House between December 16 and February 11, 2023 focused on the theme of the beauty and preservation of the oceans. A highlight of the event was to have been the presence of two submerged pavilions created by artist Doug Aitken. However, they did not arrive on the island until after the exhibit closed. Which means that those who were impatient to dive in the waters of Saint Barth in order to observe these large sculptures with their geometric mirrors were disappointed. Today, the two pavilions sit perfectly "emerged," not submerged, in huge boxes at the commercial port. At this time, no decision has been made as to their next destination. They were meant to have been moved elsewhere before the start of hurricane season in any case. It remains to be seen if those who love art and the oceans will have the chance to see them submerged here or not.

### SAILS OF CHANGE TO COMPETE IN LES VOILES DE SAINT-BARTH

The 12th edition of Les Voiles de Saint-Barth Richard Mille, setting sail April 16-22, is one of the three regattas in the 2023 IMA Caribbean Maxi Challenge (CMC\*). As of this week, 38 sailboats have committed to be on the starting line, including Raphaël Magras' Maélia Cépac Antilles, which won the New Year's Eve Parade around-the-island race on December 31, 2022. The fleet also comprises Sails of Change, a maxi trimaran 37 meters long, 23 meters wide, and weighing 21 tons. Launched in 2008, Sails of Change has an impressive track record and held the Jules Verne Trophy between 2012 and 2017 (45 days, 13 hours), and was acquired by the Spindrift team in 2013, going on to win the Route de la Découverte (between Cadix and San Salvador) and performing well in the Rolex Fastnet Race and in the Transat Québec-Saint-Malo in 2016. In addition to its racing career, Sails of Change is part of a foundation by the same name whose goal is to protect, restore, and create a sustainable future for our planet. Such as finding solutions and activities to help preserve nature and illustrate is vulnerable beauty.

One of the campaigns supported by Sails of Change is '30×30,' supported by more than 100 countries. The goal of this global call for action by the scientific community is to completely protect at least 30% of the oceans and the earth by 2030.

# Yellow Mangrove Warbler

Each week, the Journal de Saint-Barth, in partnership with the Territorial Environment Agency (ATE), presents a species (fauna or flora, terrestrial or marine) that populates the vast biodiversity of the island.

This week, the Yellow Mangrove Warbler (Setophaga petechia).



#### Where does it live?

The Yellow Mangrove Warbler lives in the Caribbean, as well as North and Latin America, the extreme southern regions of the United States, and northern coastal regions of South America (Venezuela, Colombia, Peru). However, the petechia group of these birds (which includes 16 sub-species, while the yellow warbler has 37) resides primarily in the mangroves of the West Indies.

#### What does it eat?

This bird's favorite meal is primarily made up of insects, which are abundant in the mangroves. Two thirds of their food comprises various species of caterpillars.

### Did you know?

The Yellow Mangrove Warbler lives an average of 11 years. There are different types in the West Indies, and their appearance varies with the color on their head. In Martinique, the head of this yellow warbler in primarily orange-brown, while that of Saint Barth is almost entirely yellow.

# WORK CONTINUES AROUND THE ISLAND



Since the beginning of the tourist season, the Collectivité has put much of the major roadwork on standby, yet many other projects are still being completed. For example, the infrastructure is being installed for water and electricity at the future slaughterhouse in Petite Saline. And a more visible project: construction of the new fire station by the gas station in St Jean.

However, two neighborhoods are still experiencing ongoing roadwork: Saline and Corossol. The work primarily consists of putting wires and pipes underground. And as the technical services department notes, the work is only for "short distances."

Concerning the future Cultural Center in Gustavia, the final design phases are underway before issuing tenders for the technical elements.

There are also plans afoot for a new fish market in Gustavia, and the Collectivité has started meetings with prospective enterprises to work on the project. Yet they are waiting for a letter from the DAC (Direction For Cultural Affairs), as they are engaged in an archeological investigation of the land where the new fish market will be built. The Collectivité is hoping to limit the impact as a historic boat ramp has been found.

The entry to Gustavia is also undergoing improvements, which the Collectivité feels are "advancing nicely." In fact, the construction of the exterior promenade continues without blocking traffic between Public and Gustavia, while future planter boxes should be installed soon.

Work at the pedagogical farm is also proceeding nicely, with its small buildings already completed, and numerous trees have been planted. The opening is planned for early September.

Finally, temporary structures are being built for a medical-educational institute (IME) and a specialized activities center (MAS) on the public land in Anse des Cayes. These will be used while waiting for permanent buildings to be completed in Saint Jean, at the current location of the vehicle pound.

## REGULATIONS IN EFFECT IN THE RÉSERVE NATURELLE

Following two accidents that took place in the Réserve Naturelle de Saint-Barthélemy, and which required rescue operations, the Territorial Environmental Agency points out that there are safety regulations in effect. First, the speed limit is 5 knots in all waters of the Réserve Naturelle, including the bays and a distance of 300 meters from the coast, as well as less than 100 meters from the islets around Saint Barth. This speed limit guarantees the safety of all (swimmers, sea turtles....) as well as overall tranquility of the sites. In addition, a signalization buoy is obligatory for all persons practicing scuba diving or underwater aqua trekking. No boats can go within 100 meters of that buoy. Finally, in the lagoon at Grand Cul-de-Sac, kitesurfing is only authorized more than 50 meters from the shore (other than getting the kite into the water) and is officially prohibited on the coral reef.
