The New Year's Eve Parade Setting Sail On December 31



The last day of the year in Saint Barth marks a wonderful opportunity for boats of all sizes to sail around the island in the New Year's Eve Parade. Launched in 1995, this 24-mile pursuit race serves as a nautical prelude to the New Year's Eve festivities and fireworks later in the day, this year Sunday, December 31.

Yacht broker and sailor Mark DelGiudice returns to Saint Barth every holiday season to help the Saint Barth Yacht Club with the organization of the race, which was only cancelled twice: once following hurricane Irma in 2017, and once due to storm conditions in 2020. "This event is a great way to raise funds for the St Barth Yacht Club youth sailing program," he points out.

DelGiudice notes that sailboats already con-

firmed for this year include Abbott Brown's 96' Symmetry, a frequent participant in this race, as well as the 111' Aurelius, the speedy gunboat Pheado, plus local boats Maelia and Flying Nemo. "Hopefully White Rhino will be back and more sailboats will be arriving," he says.

The skippers meeting will take place at the St Barth Yacht Club in Public between 6pm-8pm on Saturday December 30. Boats can pre-register online at stbarthyachtclub.com, under regattas.

It's lovely watching the boats sail around the island. The real question is can anyone beat the record of 1 hour, 32 minutes, and 7 seconds set back on December 31, 2004 by the 147' Baltic yacht, Visione? Perhaps if the winds are strong enough...

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The Magnetic Fields Of Kay Quattrocchi

Black holes, quantum physics, and fine art may not always go hand-in-hand but for Kay Quattrocchi subjects such as astrophysics, the Higgs Boson, and gravitational waves are forces to be dealt with. She has lived in Saint Barth for the past 31 years, where she maintains her Hilltop Gallery in Pointe Milou. Her current collection focuses on magnetic waves: “These vibrations are everywhere, in everything that lives,” says the artist. “Our heart has a magnetism 5,000 times more powerful than our brain. These magnetic fields are talking to each other before we even know it, which is why we can feel someone or something. My aim is to demonstrate “the presence” in these magnetic fields of something common to everything, an intelligent and subtle structure.

Quattrocchi’s recent astrophysical paintings explore these magnetic fields, “revealing the ether and the presence within us of an intelligent (structured) but modulable magnetic field, offering a doorway to a different kind of consciousness: both structured (general relativity) and free (quantum world),” she notes. “What if our consciousness were a kind of bridge between the two, playing a fundamental role in the observer’s gaze? For me, these magnetic fields are responses to information, memories... are we living in an old memory that is evolving and cleansing itself as we do? By changing the way we look at ourselves, are we modifying our “quantum field? What we call “awareness,” an entry into true consciousness, science, and philosophers give us the way: we are evolving, it’s up to us to “vibrate” in tune with the heart, the



source of all my inspirations,” continues the artist.

“In recent years, neuro-cardiologists have made some exciting discoveries. Our heart has its own independent nervous system. This complex system is known as the “heart brain.” It sends signals to the brain that are transmitted to the amygdala, our emotional processing center, to the thalamus, which synchronizes our cortical functions, and to the higher brain centers responsible for clarity of thought and decision-making. Your heart produces enough electrical energy to create a magnetic

field whose envelope extends beyond your body. It emits powerful electromagnetic radiation, capable of influencing the entire physical body, as well as the psychic, emotional and behavioral ones,” explains Quattrocchi. “So it’s with the heart that I decided to look at what surrounds me, hence the name of my latest collection: Magnetic.”

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St Barth Music Festival Celebrates 40 Years

The Saint Barthélemy Music Festival was created 40 years ago by Frances DeBroff, an American violinist. She invited musicians from the most prestigious orchestras to play on the island and help create a unique festival, which now features more than 40 singers, musicians, and conductors from international orchestras (United States, England, Germany, Brazil, France, Mexico, Portugal, Poland...).

The 2024 Saint Barthélemy Music Festival runs from January 15-21 and promises a wonderful edition in celebration of its 40th anniversary. Concerts include the Major Symphony Orchestra Evening and the Opera Evening, all in the idyllic setting of the island's churches, which have wonderful acoustics (see schedule below).

As of 2023, the new president of the St Barth Music Festival is Corinne Hennequin, who has been on the festival committee for 20 years. Her team includes an artistic committee comprising musicians who have long-standing relationships with the festival. Their star power is impressive but their generosity toward the island and the festival is amazing and they love to play in this tropical setting!

"The biggest surprise this year will no doubt be the candlelight concert at the Anglican Church," says Hennequin. "There will be a special ambiance, with lighting exclusively by candles, and with a harp featured in all of the pieces on the program. The same evening also features Winona Berry, a young mezzo-soprano lyric singer and island native; a very promising talent who is studying singing in Bordeaux."



Another big surprise is the festival debut of internationally acclaimed Bulgarian conductor Delyana Lazarova. She served as assistant conductor to Sir Mark Elder at the Hallé Symphony Orchestra (Manchester UK) and will conduct the festival's orchestra evening. And there is a new conductor for the popular opera evening as well, Stephan Blunier, who will most likely face a crowd for "Carmen" by George Bizet, a crowd-pleaser for sure! Creole jazz group Akoda will add their rhythms to the program with two concerts at the Anglican Church to close the festi-

val on January 20 & 21.

The Festival exists thanks to the generosity of its donors and the tourism sector of the island. In fact, the musicians are invited to perform in compensation for wonderful hospitality: airline ticket, rental car, and accommodations provided by the partners and the Association. "We are always seeking donations," admits Hennequin. "I am already thinking about the 2025 festival and would like to be able to bring back the dancers from the Paris Opera! "To perpetuate the Festival is to continue to give the island a prestigious image. We're incredibly lucky that great musicians who play on the biggest stages in the world agree to come to a small association like ours. I don't think many associations have this opportunity, so we mustn't let it go, and do everything we can to keep it going and keep them coming back to our little island, for our greatest pleasure!"

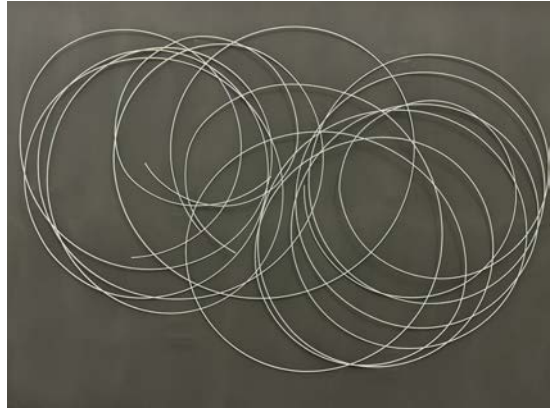

Space Gallery St Barth is thrilled to add three iconic artists to this year's ongoing Winter Exhibition, incorporating new works by Turi Simeti, Takis with his 3D kinetic magnetic wall pieces, and Tony Cragg with his emblematic sculptures.

Simeti is considered a true pioneer of 20th and 21st-century Italian art. He was one of the 30 or so artists alongside Lucio Fontana – who broke new ground in the 1950s with his Concetti spaziali (spatial concepts) – turning away from traditional painting and conventional materials and conquering space and light with their art. Simeti's work consists of dynamic patterns of ovals that dance across the monochromatic surfaces of shaped canvases. Space Gallery has several exquisite works from this series on view.

Additionally, discover artwork by Takis, the Greek artist who harnessed magnetic energy not only to create sculptures but also “Magnetic Walls.” Several pieces are exclusively on view this winter, which showcase his signature technique of shapes, magnetically “drawn” onto canvas, thus combining science and technology with natural phenomena and ancient art. A fascinating artist to discover and collect.

Plus the gallery presents new bronze sculpture by iconic British artist Tony Cragg, considered one of the world's foremost sculptors. His work is inspired by the macro and micro structures found in nature and build up the most complicated of organic forms from cellular level and recall natural geological forms, such as the sedimentation of mineral particles or suggest abstracted faces or heads.

"Do I have to go to the yacht?"

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Surfer/Artist Tony Caramanico At Summum Gallery



A familiar figure on the island where he spends the winter, American surfer and artist Tony Caramanico brings his work to Summum Gallery St Barth with “Something About The Sea,” a show running December 29, 2023-April 30, 2024. Based in Montauk, on Long Island, New York, he creates collages from fragments of journal entries and images that span over four decades, piecing together experiences and documenting life through the nomadic lens of the surfer, using a variety of different mediums, from surfboards and flags to more traditional canvases. Caramanico notes, “I felt like I was documenting a lifestyle that few people cared about from the 70s to the 90s.” The themes of this lifestyle and the evolution of his practice of record-keeping are present throughout the pieces in the exhibit, which include two special flag editions, made from recycled ocean waste, produced in collaboration with Utöpia, '74, and Summum Gallery. The exhibit was organized in partnership with Art Saint Barth, L'Officiel St Barth, and Utöpia, and curated by Jenny Mannerheim.

A New Sefer Torah For St Barth



The Chabad Of St Barth received a new Sefer Torah, a third such scroll to be used for religious services, made possible by three generous donors. A Sefer Torah is a beautifully handwritten — meticulously in Hebrew — copy of the Torah, or the Five Books of Moses (the first books of the Old Testament). The scribe who created this Torah, Rav Avraham Levi, brought it to St Barth from Israel, where he completed it on Tuesday, December 26: “a moment of great joy,” according to the local rabbi Yitzchok Gurewitsch. “It is a great honor to create a Sefer Torah,” adds Roger Cohen, a leader of the island’s Jewish community. A procession started at 6pm in Gustavia, carrying the new Torah from the Capitanerie on the main dock to the Chabad synagogue, where there was dancing to celebrate this joyous occasion. The Chabad Of St Barth offers special thanks to the Collectivity, the Prefecture, and the Territorial Police for their support in the organization of this event.

A group of 30 artists are participating in this effort to transmit a message of hope, and to raise funds for these remarkable initiatives, presenting a varied collection, from NFT (Non-Fungible Tokens) to original works of art,



by way of special flags created especially for the occasion. The auction features donated works and rare items by Daniel Arsham, Gilles Bensimon, Tui Nantaya Bhirombhakdi, The Haas Brothers, Tony Caramanico, Philip Colbert, Marco Glaviano, Rémy de Haenen, Rachel Hayes, Krista Kim, Jessica Lichtenstein, Victor Matthews, Robert Montgomery, Roger Moreau, Brian Bowen Smith, Laurie Lynn Stark, José Parlá, Enoc Perez, Hannah
