The Saint Barth Bucket Sets Sail March 21-24



The Nantucket Bucket in the summer of 1986 paved the way for the winter version of the event in Saint Barth as of March 1995. It has evolved into the the yachting world's premiere superyacht event for owners, crew, and guests on simply spectacular sailboats, many of which are over 100' long. The Port of Gustavia is at its finest as these nautical beauties sail in and out of the harbor for a few days of magical racing. A few highlights for 2024 include:

unparalleled ORCs class racing in the popular pursuit racing format will provide yacht owners with exciting, close competition against yachts with similar sailing characteristics; The Corinthian Spirit Class racing, which featured 12 entries last year, will return to its roots and once again be a non-spinnaker competition; and based on strong early interest, the 90-foot class is expected to make a return to St Barths. The Bucket Stewards will accept the first six entries (criteria to be posted with the NOR).

Peter Craig, event organizer, and Jeanne Kleene, event

manager, have noted that a 100-foot Racing Class will be offered for the first time, comprising performance-oriented sloops over 100' LOA and that do not fit the SYRA's 'cruising superyacht' criteria.' Building on 2023 and in the spirit of being inclusive, social (non-racing) entrants will again be welcome to the Bucket. "Sailing or motor yachts wishing to participate in the Bucket as non-racing social entries are encouraged to request an invitation to the 2024 edition. A limited number of non-racing entry applications will be accepted," add the organizers.

There are 36 entries to date, including the fabulous 286' Maltese Falcon, a sight to behold as it conquers the waves, in the social entries class, and the classic J-Class, 130' Velsheda, built in 1933 by Camper and Nicholsons at Gosport, Hampshire. 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FEMUR: Raising Funds For Medical Equipment

Healthcare is a hot topic in Saint Barthélemy, with a lot of questions and concerns swirling about the local hospital in Gustavia and the new medical center in Saint Jean, which the Collectivity has opened to provide office space for medical specialists who visit the island on a rotational basis. Behind the scenes is FEMUR – St Barth Medical Equipment Foundation—which was founded in 1983 by a dedicated group of French, American, and native St Barth residents, including Raymond Magras, who worked hard on behalf of the organization until his death this year, and the late Larry O’Donnell. There is a St Barth chapter, whose current president is Ernest Brin, director of the Port of Gustavia, and FEMUR also hosts an American 501C3 Charitable Foundation so that donations from Americans are tax deductible under IRS rules, with Melanie Smith as president and Dawn Drouant Gumbs as treasurer. All involved are volunteers: “The only expenses are banking and accounting fees, so that all donations go to the purchase of equipment,” explains Smith.

To raise money to purchase necessary equipment for the island, FEMUR works with the hospital to determine what items are needed to improve service and care for islanders and visitors, and the FEMUR board is looking forward to the appointment of a new director for the De Bruyn Hospital in Gustavia, to work more closely in the future. “Over the years, an estimated 500 to 600 people have made donations,” says Smith, who points out that the operating procedure is for “doctors, hospital management, the fire station’s



medical team, and others to identify needed equipment for lifesaving and sophisticated diagnostic purposes. FEMUR safeguards that all the equipment and supplies remain in SBH for the benefit of its residents and visitors through special contract with the Collectivity.”

Examples of donations prior to 2020 include an electrocardiograph machine, a stretcher, a tensiometer, a DYNAMAP Pro 1000 defibrillator, incubators for babies, a state-of-the-art X-ray machine capable of international transmission, several life packs, and many smaller items. “FEMUR was also instrumental in the complicated purchase of the first scanner nearly 10 years ago,” notes Smith. In 2021, purchases ranged from various materials for the hospital (67,866 euros) and the new CT scanner at the hospital for 774,100 euros with the participation of the Collectivity. Purchases in 2022 comprised a Biocon 700 bladder scanner for the hospital for 10,764 euros and Holter cardiograph register and software for the hospital for 6,890 euros. In 2023, FEMUR

purchased cardiologist material (Ultrasound + accessories) for the new “Maison de la Santé” medical center for 65,800 euros (with an additional 35,000 euros allocated). In transit to St Barth is a computer for the hospital to serve for communication between family and patients), purchased for 5,660 euros, as well as a special electric bed and accessories for heavy patients at the hospital (3,446.47 euros), a special pump for cancer patients (1,000 euros), five special beds and other materials for the hospital (10,877 euros). “This is just a drop in the bucket,” notes Smith, “there have been many other small items over the years.”

Smith quotes the words of Dr. Peter Mund, written over 40 years ago in 1983: ““We all care about St. Barth: its beauty, ambiance, and quality of life, and we continually strive to preserve and improve these conditions...” Even today, these words still hold true as we continue our efforts to keep St. Barths special,” she says. “Today, the hospital is still small, but it continues to serve more and more people every year. The hos-

pital has larger needs, but it receives the same support from the government. We are extremely grateful for any donation you can make, no matter how big or small.”

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SAINT BARTH AND ITS BIODIVERSITY

Anguilla Bank Skink

Each week, Le Journal de Saint-Barth, in partnership with the Territorial Environmental Agency (ATE), invites you to discover a local species (fauna or flora, terrestrial, or marine) that makes up the vast biodiversity of the island. This week, a look at the Anguilla Bank Skink (*Spondylurus powelli*).



• Where is it found?

This lizard is uniquely endemic to Saint Barthélemy, Saint Martin (Tintamarre), and Anguilla, and is not found elsewhere. The skink's habitat is xerophilous forest and dry rock walls.

• What are its characteristics?

The skink, whose local name is the bastard snake, looks like a cross between a lizard and a snake. It's actually a slender, shiny lizard with tiny legs. It is both terrestrial (living on the ground) and arboreal (living in trees). This cold-blooded insectivore is active during the day, thanks to the warmth of the sun. It's the only viviparous lizard on the island, and the young resemble the adult but have a blue tail, growing up to 3" without the tail.

• Do you know?

Its local name, the bastard snake, comes from an old belief that this lizard is a hybrid between a garter snake and an earth lizard. It is often confused with the scaled lizard that basks in the sun, a smaller, lighter lizard with four legs, which is exogenous to South America. The Anguilla Bank Skink is classified as "endangered" on the world's red list of threatened species, and is protected in Saint Barthelemy. To protect the skink, remember to bring your cats inside at night.

West Indies Regatta: New Wind In Its Sails



Since setting sail in Saint Barth in 2009, the West Indies Regatta has aimed to promote the dying art of Caribbean boatbuilding and share the experience of sailing on these unique craft—wood and canvas powered by the wind. One of the regatta’s founders, Alexis Andrews is the owner of Genesis, an Enoe-42 'Carriacou sloop built by Alwyn Enoe and his crew, in a trade passed down from generation to generation starting with the Scottish settlers that arrived in the 18th century. Andrews is also the director of the excellent award-winning documentary, *Vanishing Sail*, which documents the realization of another Enoe sloop, *Exodus*. Both Genesis and Exodus have sailed in the West Indies Regatta, along with the third and most recent Enoe sloop, *Free in Saint Barth*, owned by Thierry de Badereau and which made its debut in the regatta in 2016, and took first place!

Due to Covid, the regatta was suspended in 2021 and 2022, but was back last year in 2023, with major

support from the Collectivity of Saint Barthélemy and organization leadership on the island from Lorraine Retif. “This year the organization has expanded, with Valentine de Badereau and Rachel Trangmar joining the committee, and we have more help for security...,” says Retif. “We are also asking Thierry de Badereau, the only owner of a traditional wooden sloop in Saint Barth to take a more prominent position as the host boat, with a motto such as “Sailing Free In Saint Barth.” The original organizers will take a step back and pass the torch to the next generation.”

Wooden masts with traditional sails unfurl as the boats set off to the sound of a conch shell used as nature’s trumpet, and the races evoke the golden age when these kinds of wooden vessels were used to carry goods from one island to another. In keeping with that era, the regatta features an artisanal market that showcases arts & crafts, organic produce, and unique specialty products from all the islands, coming with the boats

that sail up from Antigua, Grenada, Carriacou, and other islands to the south of St Barth, for races that are mostly for fun and everyone is considered a winner. In addition to the night market, there are live music concerts, performances by the CIE Déo circus, and picnics at Shell Beach and Colombier.

This year, the West Indies Regatta takes place on April 26-28, 2024, with the following boats expected: *Free In St. Barth*, *Genesis*, *Navasana*, *New Moon*, *Tradition*, *Ongoing Java*, and *Blue Peter*. School children will be invited to see the boats, and some even get to sail. Hopefully they will take an interest in these traditional sailing ships and who knows, maybe one day in the near future we’ll see a Saint Barth boat-building project, plank by plank, take shape. The regatta is a great way to celebrate the history as well as the future of traditional Caribbean boat building.

Jazzing Things Up

Jazz is in the air from March 17-April 7, as the Saint Book Book & Jazz Festival takes center stage on the island's cultural calendar. Organized by the association, Saint B'Art, the festival features acclaimed musicians in a series of free concerts at various restaurants. In addition, the book side of things comprises ateliers in the schools and at the territorial library from March 18-23, with illustrators Véronique Massenot and Sébastien Chebret, scenarist Alain Gardinier, comic book designer Renaud Garetta, and poet/actor Hicham Nazzal. The association's annual book fair will take place a month later, on the dock in Gustavia, on Sunday, May 5, as one of the many activities they produce year-round.

The opening of the jazz concerts presents singer Thomas Kahn at L'Esprit in Saline on Monday, March 25, at Manapany on Tuesday, March 26, and at Le Select on Wednesday, March 27. On the afternoon of March 27, jazz ateliers will be held at the Music School with singer Annie Lalalove, and musicians



Vincent Martinez (guitar), Julien Audigier (drums), and Vincent Echard (Trumpet). Concerts continue with the Annie Lalalove Quartet on Thursday, March 28 at Eddy's Ghetto, Friday, March 29 at Le Tropical Hotel, and Saturday, March 30 at Gyp Sea Hotel. Wednesday, April 3, music moves to the Wall

House Museum with a master class for local musicians led by the V.H. Sambin Sextet, which also performs on Thursday, April 4 at Le Barthélemy Hotel, on Saturday evening, April 5 on the beach at the Saint Barth Yacht Club in Public with a BBQ, and at

the festival closer at Arawak on Saturday, April 6.

"Saint Barthélemy is proud to be hosting its traditional jazz and book festival again this year," says president of the territorial council Xavier Lédée. "The Collectivity fully supports this wonderful initiative and appreciates the efforts made by the organizers to welcome such talented artists and authors. We are fortunate to be able to count on an increasingly inventive and influential cultural community on our island."

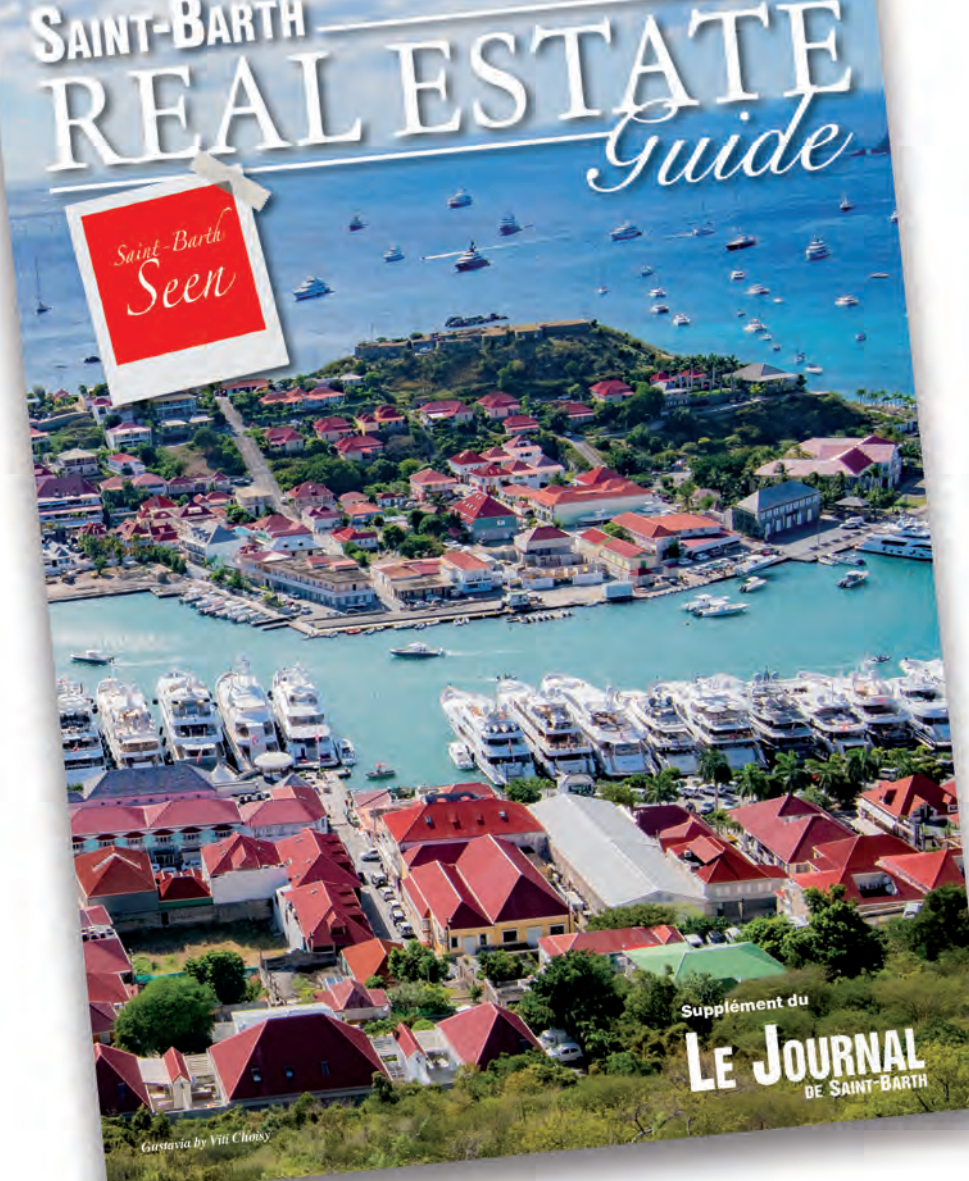
